NOTES

Note A. After a series of scheduled meetings of which the only note in the Minutes Book is "No quorum," the Civil War brought about a lapse in Institute activities which was ended by the meeting of Mar. 5, 1864.

From 1857 until 1867 a Board of Trustees, five in number, later seven, was the supreme authority, electing Institute officers annually. In 1867 the Convention became the ruling authority, electing officers thereafter.

Note B. For the years 1860 through 1863 there is no record of an election to the vice presidencies.

Note C. From the early years the Institute Trustees elected a Librarian as well as a Secretary, though Richard M. Hunt held both offices from Feb. 1857 until Jan. 1861. The post was held thereafter by Charles D. Gambrell, Jan. 1, 1861-Jan. 1, 1868; A. J. Bloor, '68-'71; and by Joseph Ireland, '71-'72, when the office of Librarian was discontinued and the duties transferred to a new Committee on Library.

In addition to the "Recording Secretary" or Secretary, it was customary to elect a Secretary for Foreign Correspondence. H. H. Richardson, Wm. B. Ware, Henry A. Sims and Henry Van Brunt served in this capacity from June, 1866 through 1876, after which it seemed that the Secretary himself could shoulder the foreign correspondence.

Note D. On Feb. 10, 1887 an amendment to the Bylaws provided that each president of an Institute chapter should be, ex officio, a vice president of the Institute. In the years in which this was in effect the following men thus qualified as presidents of their respective chapters:

NOTES continued

Note 1: After much preliminary discussion in the two chief executive offices of the period - Western Society of Architects and the A. I. A. - merged at Chicago and under a new formation comprising the best features of both old ones, and the Institute's 1960 name.

Beginning with this convention at New York in 1961, the vice president and a third vice president were elected for one year, their terms of office being that of the president beginning Jan. 1st.

Note 2: Several retirements in the interests of the Institute were necessary in 1962 and 1963. The

Board members were re-elected in 1962, and the 1963 convention was attended. Retiring officers, whose terms expired were replaced by their respective regions. Officers continue to serve until their successors could be elected. Even the 1964 convention felt the pressure of the Depression and a change of size and representation.

Note 3: In the reorganizing of governing under By-laws June 1, 1960, the office of Executive Secretary was abolished after the incumbent elected in 1955 had have completed his term.

Note 4: The 1961 Convention had been scheduled to be held in May, 1961. To comply with a calendar change and the War effort the meeting was held in Boulder, May 1961 in the city. Seven members of the Board, appointed as delegates, were present to participate. The meeting was attended by the Executive Organization Meeting and the Board. It was an important step in the reorganization. These were the first steps, and the Board continued to be organized, elected, and their successors should have been elected to carry on and members would be elected in 1961.

The 1961 re-elected Convention was held Apr. 24 and 25 in Atlanta, Ga. The delegates were limited to 700, appointed by the chairmen, and based on an approximate 100 representative system.

The 1961 Annual Meeting would have been the 20th Convention. No convention having been convened in 1944, the number 20 properly applied to the 1961 Convention. However, because the 1947 Convention was called No. 27 and the error was discovered the year following, 1948, it seems we have to accept a renumbering.
