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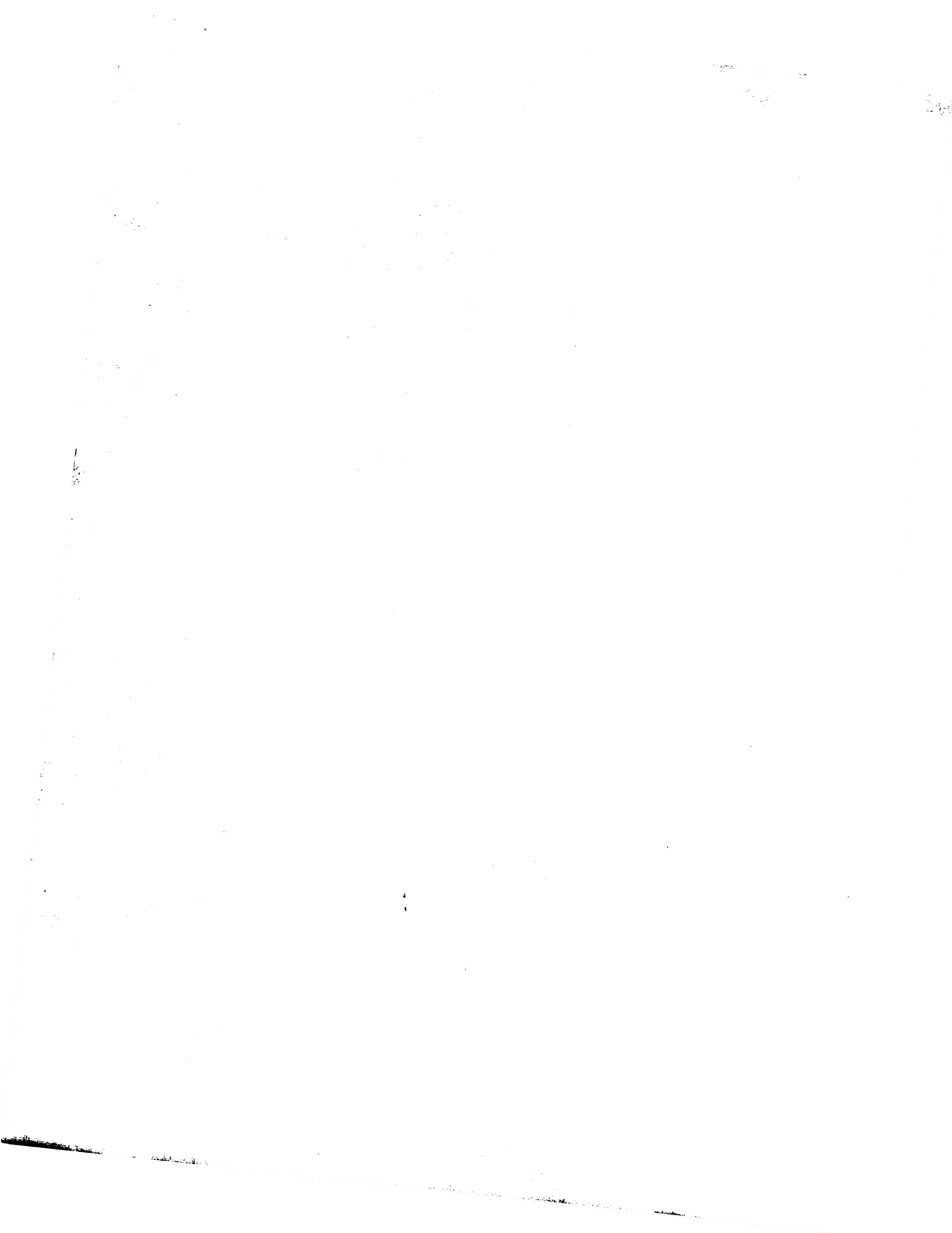

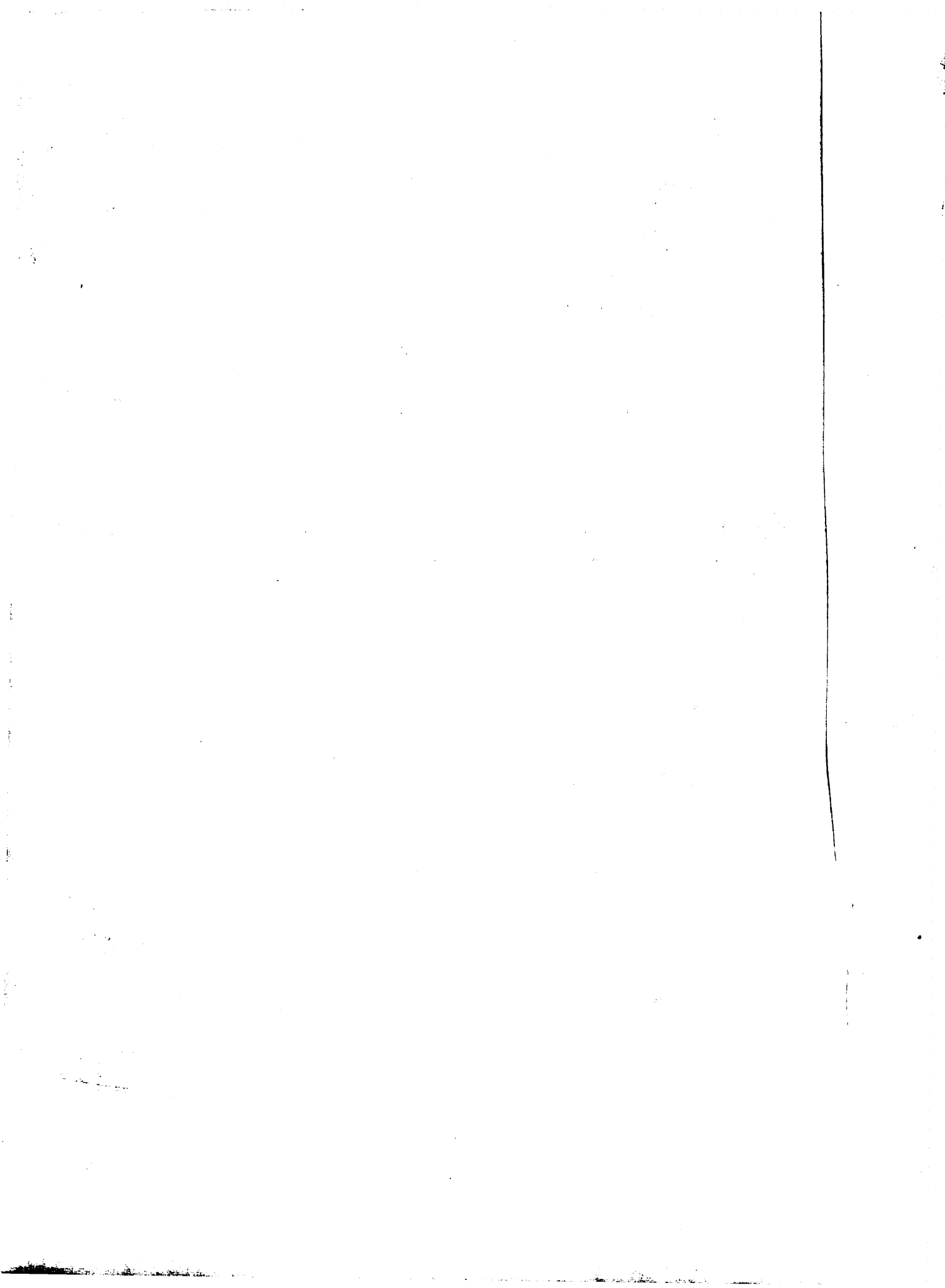

### NOTES

Note A. After a series of scheduled meetings of which the only note in the Minutes Book is "No quorum," the Civil War brought about a lapse in Institute activities which was ended by the meeting of Mar. 5, 1864.

From 1857 until 1867 a Board of Trustees (five in number, later seven) was the supreme authority, electing Institute officers annually. In 1867 the Convention became the ruling authority, electing officers thenceforth.

Note B. For the years 1860 through 1863 there is no record of an election to the vice presidencies.

Note C. From the early years the Institute Trustees elected a Librarian as well as a Secretary, though Richard M. Hunt held both offices from Feb. 1857 until Jan. 1861. The post was held thereafter by Charles D. Gambrell, Jan. 1, 1861-Jan. 1, 1868; A. J. Bloor, '68-'71; and by Joseph Ireland, '71-'72, when the office of Librarian was discontinued and the duties transferred to a new Committee on Library.

In addition to the "Recording Secretary" or Secretary, it was customary to elect a Secretary for Foreign Correspondence. H. H. Richardson, Wm. B. Ware, Henry A. Sims and Henry Van Brunt served in this capacity from June, 1866 through 1876, after which it seemed that the Secretary himself could shoulder the foreign correspondence.

Note D. On Feb. 10, 1867 an amendment to the Bylaws provided that each president of an Institute chapter should be, ex officio, a vice president of the Institute. In the years in which this was in effect the following men thus qualified as presidents of their respective chapters:

## NOTES continued

Note E. After much preliminary discussion the two chief architectural societies of the period—Western Society of Architects and the A. I. A. merged at Cincinnati under a new constitution combining the best features of both old ones, and the Institute's older name.

Beginning with the Convention of Nov. 1889 a 1st vice president and a 2nd vice president were elected each year, their terms of office, like that of the president, beginning Jan. 1st.

Note F. Severe retrenchment in the activities of the Institute were necessary in 1932 and 1933. The Board meetings were reduced in frequency and the 1933 Convention was omitted. Regional directors whose terms expired were replaced by their respective regions. Officers continued to serve until their successors could be elected. Even the 1934 Convention felt the pressure of the Depression in reduction of size and representation.

Note G. In the combining of Constitution and By-laws, June, 1930, the office of 2nd vice president was abolished "after the incumbent elected in 1935 shall have completed his term."

Note H. The 76th Convention had been scheduled for Indianapolis, May 3-5, 1944. To comply with legal requirements and the War effort the meeting was called to order on May 3rd in that city. Seven members of the Board, qualified as delegates, were present—no quorum. The meeting was adjourned subject to the call of the President. The Board, however, held its Organization Meeting and the directors whose terms expired submitted their resignations. These were not accepted, and the Board continued the incumbents in office until their successors should qualify; committee chairmen and members were also continued in office.

For 1945 a reduced Convention was held Apr. 24 and 25 in Atlantic City. The delegates were limited to 50, appointed by the chapters on a basis of one to an approximate 160 corporate members.

The 1944 Annual Meeting would have been the 76th Convention. No convention having been consummated in 1944, the number 76 properly applied to the 1945 Convention. However, in error the 1945 Convention was called No. 77 and the error was unobserved through following conventions.

Note I. The 1964 Convention elected a First Vice President and President-designate; and three Vice Presidents.
