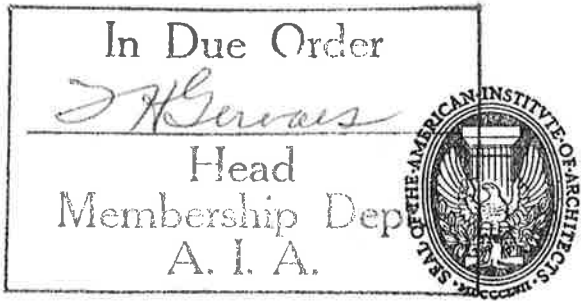


Dear Miss Gervais:

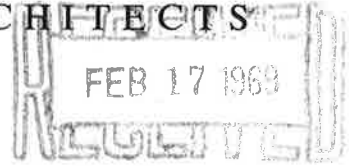
