Dear Mr. Nellenbogen:

Please forgive this long delay in responding to your inquiry of January 24th. We have been under great pressure of heavy correspondence and many meetings for several months, and have been unable to handle correspondence as promptly as we would wish.

In checking the records I find that you owe for your 1957 and 1958 Institute dues, and under our established procedure if the 1957 dues are not paid by March 1st it will be necessary to suspend your corporate membership.

Suspended members, however, are carried on the membership rolls of The Institute for one year following, in order to permit them to reinstate their good stending by payment of such defaulted dues. Therefore, your membership will be carried on that basis throughout 1958, as matters now stand.
