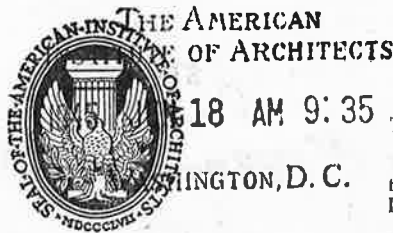

Dear Mr. Nellenbogen:

Please forgive this long delay in responding to your inquiry of January 24th. We have been under great pressure of heavy correspondence and many meetings for several months, and have been unable to handle correspondence as promptly as we would wish.

In checking the records I find that you owe for your 1957 and 1958 Institute dues, and under our established procedure if the 1957 dues are not paid by March 1st it will be necessary to suspend your corporate membership.

Suspended members, however, are carried on the membership rolls of The Institute for one year following, in order to permit them to reinstate their good standing by payment of such defaulted dues. Therefore, your membership will be carried on that basis throughout 1958, as matters now stand.

It is noted you will be 70 years of age in May, and on that point you would be eligible for election as a Member Emeritus. Members Emeritus retain all of the rights and privileges of active corporate membership, while being exempted from the payment of further Institute and Chapter dues.

However, another requirement is 15 years of membership in good standing immediately prior to application for this membership, and you have been a member only since 1945. This particular requirement may be waived, as you will note from the enclosed application form, and it is suggested that you fill it in, sign and forward it to the Secretary of the Florida South Chapter, with the request that the Chapter recommend to The Institute that this be done.

With reference to the dues you would owe - for 1957 and half of 1958 - you might file a request that these dues be waived, giving the reasons therefor, and send this along with your application for Membership Emeritus to the Chapter Secretary also.

The Board of The Institute almost invariably follows the recommendations of the chapters in such instances.

For your ready information, the Secretary of the Florida South Chapter is Mr. Charles Robert Abele, A.I.A., 550 Brickell Avenue, Miami.

A copy of this letter is being sent to him so that he will be informed of the situation should you decide to follow the above suggested procedure.
