2. Describe nominee's notable work in design, to bring out the particular achievements the nominators believe have notably contributed to the advancement of the profession.

George Nemeny has worked for the advancement of Architecture, bringing good design to the attention of a large segment of the population, both by teaching and his work.

In the thirties he was one of the pioneers in introducing contemporary architecture to the American public. In his work he has consistently been concerned with quality and good planning, the use of appropriate materials, the massing and structural integrity of his buildings, as well as their relation to the site and human needs. He imparted these principles to his students at Yale, Cornell and Columbia.

At the Centennial of The American Institute of Architects, 1957, one of Mr. Nemeny's buildings (Upper Manhattan Medical Group Building) was selected as one of "Ten Buildings in America's Future." It was commented that: "The simplicity and clarity of its plan ... counterbalanced by careful detailing and decoration ... achieved a friendly building, intimate in feeling, warm in expression."

In two successive years, 1963 and 1964, George Nemeny won the A.I.A. Honors Award for the Safir and Favata residences respectively. Of the latter the Jury commented: "A disarmingly direct solution resulting in an honest, straight-forward residence. This is an unpretentious house, displaying great restraint, with no frills or tricks. The materials are handsomely used and excellently detailed."
