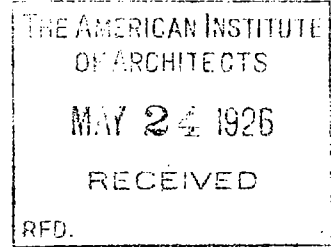



Dear Mr. Northrop:

This is the first opportunity to acknowledge and thank you for your remittance of \$10.00, on account of Institute dues.

On December 31st and in order to preserve your membership in good standing at the end of 1935, we acted with the authority of the Board and applied to your account for 1935 all credits which you had for 1936 as the result of the adjusted dues plan in effect in 1931-1933.
