My dear Mr. Nosek:

You are a member of the Institute in good standing and assigned to the Cleveland Chapter.

Under the By-laws of the Institute each member must maintain his Chapter membership as well as his national membership.

We are advised by the Chapter that you are indebted for Chapter dues.

The Chapter does not want to lose your membership, but it feels in fairness to the other members that the account should be adjusted or that the affiliation should be terminated.

The Institute Executive Committee feels that it must support the Chapter in a matter of this kind, and on the other hand, it never terminates a membership for financial reasons except as a last resort.
