Responding to yours of September 14th, with regard to the statement for balance of your 1951 Institute dues, and your pending resignation as a member of the A.I.A. and the Western Michigan Chapter to which you are assigned:

As you will note from our letter of April 24th when we wrote about your resignation, we stated that it would have to be cleared through the Chapter as well.

Advice from the Chapter has been to the effect that you owe for chapter dues for 1949 and 1950, at least, and we have not received further word to the effect that you have taken care of such dues.

Dear Mr. O'Bryon:

Your two letters of October 9th and 12th are received, with regard to the membership status of Messrs. S. Eugene Osgood and St. Clare Pardee, assigned to the Western Michigan Chapter.

We note that Mr. Osgood has paid his chapter dues for 1949 and 1950, but not for 1951. Previously you had stated that he did not wish to resign from the Chapter - just from the A.I.A. As you have set forth, the procedure would be to resign from both, and then apply for election as an associate of the Chapter, which may be done if the Chapter approves.




Dear Mr. Rankin:

Reference is made to your letter of October 18, 1951 to this Chapter about the membership status of Mr. S. Eugene Osgood. I regret that it has been necessary to bring this unanswered letter to our attention.

We have a letter from Mr. Osgood dated January 7, 1952 requesting that his membership in the Western Michigan Chapter, A. I. A., be cancelled as he had retired from the practice of Architecture. On October 12, 1951 he paid his 1950 and 1949 dues to this Chapter to enable him to resign from the Institute.

The Chapter has no desire to hinder Mr. Osgood's resignation from the Institute or this Chapter and recommends that his wishes be followed. However, it appears that Mr. Osgood might be considered eligible for Retirement, exemption from annual dues, and entitled to become a Member Emeritus. He has passed the age of seventy, retired from business, and been a corporate member of this Chapter since 1940. His firm of Osgood & Osgood was founded in 1904 and gained national recognition as consultants on Masonic Temple architecture. If further chapter action might be required, I should appreciate your suggestions.
