

Mr. Olmsted was a member of the architectural firm of Murphy & Olmsted, architects for the Shrine of the Sacred Heart Catholic Church, number of buildings at Catholic University and for other wellknown structures in this city.

was employed in the office of the Supervising Architect of the Treasury. He was a member of the American Institute of Architects.
