





MONTGOMERY MEIGS ORR

Montgomery Meigs Orr, 88, was born on June 7, 1911, at the American Embassy in Rio de Janeiro, Brazil. He died peacefully at home in Santa Fe, New Mexico, on January 16, 2000. His parents were Arthur Orr, a U.S. Foreign Service Officer, and Alice Meigs Orr. She owned and ran Bear Creek Ranch in Ennis, Montana. Monty grew up in Paris, France, and St. Charles, Illinois, and graduated from St. Paul's School in Concord, New Hampshire in 1929. In 1933, he graduated Summa Cutn Laude and Phi Beta Kappa from Princeton University with an AB degree in Architecture. He was a member of the Triangle Club and a lifetime member of the Quadrangle Club. After his father's unexpected death; he began work at the Chicago architectural firm of Holabird and Root instead of accepting his full scholarship at L'Ecole des Beaux Arts, Paris, France.

Next, he worked for the firm of Frazier and Raftery in Geneva, Illinois. He became a partner in what was then Frazier Raftery, Orr and Frirbank, working in Geneva and Chicago until his retirement in 1978. His work included residential, historical renovations such as Jane Addam's Hull House in Chicago, and the 1907 Cleveland Trust Bank, the first hospital in Ennis, schools, banks, offices, and other commercial buildings such as Quaker Oats in Chicago. He was a member of the A.I.A., American Institute of Architects. During WWII, he supervised secret installations for communications and sound equipment on ships and submarines for DuKane Co. in St. Charles.

Monty lived in Wayne, Illinois, from 1938 to 1978 with his wife Louise McCormick whom he married in 1935. Active in the Wayne community, he served as deacon in the Congregational Church, Boy Scout leader, and member of many boards and committees such as the Wayne Planning Commission. He pursued varied interests including amateur theatricals, skeet shooting and bird hunting, riding in Montana and fox hunting. He was Field Master of the Wayne DuPage Hunt. He loved downhill skiing, tennis and squash, travel, watercolor painting, birding, cooking and gardening. Fly-fishing was his life-long passion; Antelope Basin at Beat Creek Ranch was his favorite summer fishing destination.

In 1972, he and Louise designed their ideal house in Santa Fe, and moved there in 1978. He studied solar and adobe architecture and designed several houses, studios, additions and renovations. Monty will especially be remembered for his long, devoted care of his wife who died in 1993, his gracious acceptance of his own declining health, his gentle wit and many stories, courtly manners and modesty, his love of nature and his artist's eye.

He is survived by his sister Mary Ann Orr of Cape Elizabeth, ME; his brother Arthur Orr, his wife Carol of Ennis; his daughter Bonnie Brooks Orr Miskolczy, her husband Gabor of Carlisle, MA: his son Michael McCormick Orr, his wife Kustina of Tucson, AZ and two granddaughters, Marta Meigs Miskolczy, her husband Charles Becvarik of Santa Fe and Emma Louise Orr of Tucson; three nieces, two nephews, four great nieces and five great nephews.

A private memorial service will be held for family and friends in Santa Fe. In lieu of flowers, donations may be made to the Montgomery Meigs Orr Memorial Fund for Ennis Hospital, Box 848, Ennis, MT 59729.
