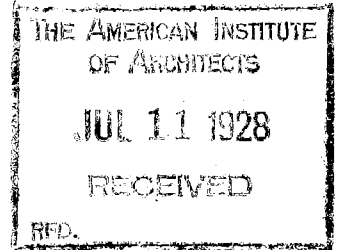

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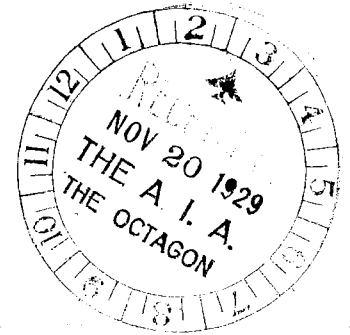

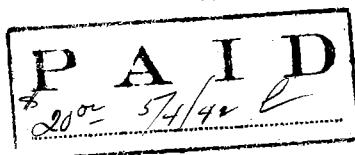

With further reference to your letter of April 30 to Secretary Ingham and the applications of Mr. Wilfred A. Paine and Mr. Wilbert C. Roman for reinstatement to corporate membership in The Institute:

It is noted that both men were advised that aside from payment of past indebtednesses to The Institute, the cost of reinstatement was \$20.00 with no admission charge.

Please note that applications for reinstatement must also be accompanied by the regular admission fee of \$5.00. Therefore, each of these applicants should forward an additional remittance of \$5.00.

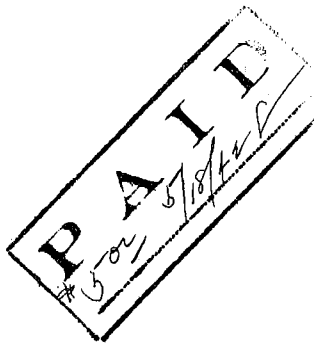

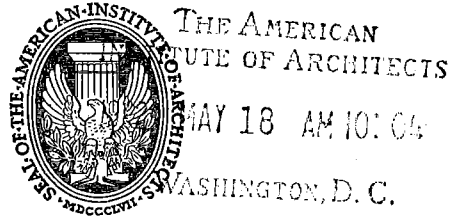

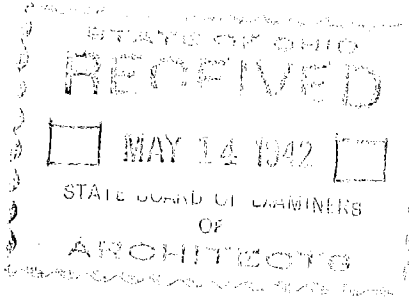

Dear Mr. Goller:

At the present time there are pending from the Columbus Chapter the applications for reinstatement to corporate membership in The Institute of Messrs. W. A. Paine and W. C. Ronan.

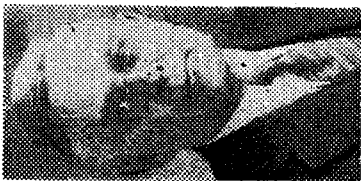

LOCAL DEATHS Wilfred Paine Dies

Wilfred A. Paine, 65, well-known architect and member of the firm of Paine & Crumley, who had designed many of the large buildings here, died in Mt. Carmel hospital Tuesday evening after having been stricken earlier in the day with a heart attack at his office, 584 E. Broad St.



Associated with Richards, McCarty & Bulford since 1905, Mr. Paine became the senior member of the firm of Paine & Crumley, their successors. Among the many large buildings of the city which he designed are the two American Education Press buildings, Columbus Gallery of Fine Arts and the Motorist Mutual and the Columbus Mutual Life Insurance buildings on E. Broad St.

Mr. Paine, a native of Central Falls, R. I., received his architectural training at the Massachusetts Institute of Technology, and before coming to Columbus was employed in architectural offices in Providence, R. I., Boston and Indianapolis.

He was a member of First Congregational church and of the American Institute of Architects, and a past president of the Columbus chapter, A. I. A. With his wife, Mrs. Jessie Paine, there also survive a daughter, Mrs. Clyde O. Davis, Woodbury, N. J.; two grandsons and a brother, Ernest Paine, Ithica, N. Y.

Mr. Boyton Merrill will officiate at funeral services to be held at 10 a. m. Friday in the Schoedinger chapel. Interment will be in Green Lawn.
