

Dear Sirs:

Referring back to your letter of December 11, 1950, I am sorry to report that I am able to furnish very little data under the heading of Professional Training.

Before I had completed my high school training, I did work to an Architect two years. He had received his license under the "Grandfather" clause and is not considered an eithical and accredited Architect. Because of this employment and because of the times (1929 to 1932) I was unable to get any employment in the Architectural field in or near Portland. However, I did continue with college night school, home studies, and had some employment with an Engineering Company in Portland and Seattle, Washington, and work on construction projects.

In the year 1932, I opened an office of my own, known as Plan Service for Contractors. This office soon expanded to where I was having Architects and Engineers as associates with me on larger projects. Donald L. Dougan, Architect, was one of my principal associates for a period of three years. I not only prepared plans for the contractors, but also prepared preliminaries, working and detailed drawings, specifications, and gave supervision to a good many projects for individual clients.

I made application for an Architect's license sometime in the early part of 1940, at which time the Oregon Board of Architect's Examiners made an investigation into my qualifications. Because of the class and type of work I had been turning out as self-employed, the Board gave me permission to proceed with the examinations. I completed the examinations and was duly licensed in the State of Oregon in 1943.

I now have my office in my own building which I built in 1942 and employ on an average of two assistants to help me with a small but exclusive general practice of Architecture. As you see, most of my training has come the hard way and by self-employment.
