Fresno Man Wins 1982 Presidency

SACRAMENTO—William E. Patnaude of Fresno emerged winner in a contested race yesterday to become vice president/president-elect of the California Council/American Institute of Architects. As such he will step up to become council president in 1982. Harry Hallenbeck of Alameda is to be CC/AIA president in 1981.

Patnaude was challenged for the position by Edgar Leroy Huxley of San Diego.

The election came at a meeting of CC/AIA directors held in advance of the cocktail party which opened the council's 35th Annual Convention. Convention events run throughout today and tomorrow. The affair is to conclude Sunday morning with tennis and racquet ball tournaments.

In other contested races, the directors elected these individuals:

—Secretary: Harry Jacobs, Oakland. He was running against Inge Rose from Pasadena.

—Directors: George Bissell, FAIA, North Beach, and Peter Winkelstein, FAIA, San Francisco. There was a field of four competing for two director seats. Losing out were Howard Lane, FAIA, Woodland Hills and Arthur Silvers, San Luis Obispo.

—Vice president-governmental relations: William B. Vick, Jr., Sacramento. Vick ran successfully against Merle Gilliland, Walnut Creek.

—Vice president-professional development: Paul Neel, San Luis Obispo. He had been challenged for the position by Charles Schrader, San Francisco.

—Vice president-public awareness: Richard G. Conklin, Los Angeles. He ran against Donald Gibbs, FAIA, Long Beach.

Unchallenged for the Northern and Southern California associate director posts were Elizabeth

Pidgeon, Monterey and Erik Johnson, Newport Beach.

The architect council is slated to move its headquarters from San Francisco to Sacramento early in the coming year and the directors

accepted the recommendations of a special committee headed by San Francisco architect

Donald Wüdtke. They approved the taking of space on the 3rd floor of the Old Telephone Building at 1414 K St. here.

In keeping with the tone and temper of the times the new office space offers easy accessibility to the handicapped, among other things.

Professionally the new president-elect is a vice president of Allen Lew & William Patnaude, Inc. in

Fresno. He has served on the Fresno Uniform Building Code Committee and has been a member of the Fresno Arts Center since 1970. He also served on the State Board of Architectural Examiners for two years, was secretary of CC/AIA in 1970 and 1980, and was 1980 president of the CC/AIA Foundation.

Alluding to the move to Sacramento, Patnaude has said, "We must deal with issues that are statewide in scope and interest and we must deal with them in a cost-effective manner. The office must be restructured to reflect demands of board policy which are evidenced by the move. The next year will be most hectic and very important to the future of the council."

CCAIA's convention — most sessions are being held at Sacramento's new Community/Convention Center — gets underway in earnest today with a keynote address by Gerald McCue FAIA. McCue is a transplanted Bay Area architect and educator who is currently serving as Dean at Harvard's Graduate School of Design. His appearance at the convention is being underwritten by Ford Glass of Detroit.

Whereas: William E. Patnaude, AIA, is and has been a leader among the architectural community for the past decade;



2. Description of Specific Achievements in Field of Service to Profession

Mr. Patnaude became a member of the Institute in 1972 and immediately became very active in Chapter affairs. He was nominated and elected to Chapter office in 1973 and during his subsequent six years on the Chapter Board held most major offices, culminating in the office of President. During those years he was directly involved in a process that changed the Chapter from a small social organization that reacted to occasional crises to one which was structured to proactively further the interests of the profession on the local and State level. As Vice President he reorganized the meeting format and, by securing major speakers and programs, increased Chapter attendance at the meetings by an average of 400%. He strengthened the ties between local government and the Chapter by initiating a "Local Politician's Night" where the Chapter members met with local politicians. During his tenure as an officer in the Chapter, the membership increased by 65%, a Chapter office was established and an Executive Secretary was employed. Through his interest in State affairs, he was able to get the Chapter to take a more active part in State and Regional affairs. As an example, where the Chapter normally would have had one representative at the Board level, for the past few years it has enjoyed representation by five (5) individual members on basically the same size Board; with two (2) members on the Executive Committee. He continues to devote considerable time to Chapter activities, serving on numerous committees and task forces.

In retrospect, Mr. Patnaude's major contribution to the Chapter has been as a catalyst, organizer and guide that started the Chapter on the path from that of a small entity considering only local issues to an organization that has become a major force in the State, with subsequent officers of the Chapter assuming important roles in State leadership. He changed the scope and direction of the Chapter; a direction which has continued to this date.

Mr. Patnaude, in his service at the State/Regional level, became the first Architect from the San Joaquin Valley area to be elected to the Presidency of the California Council in its forty-year History. During his one-year term as Director on the CCAIA Board of Directors as the Delegate from his Chapter, he was nominated and unanimously elected as Secretary of the Council. This commenced a four-year tenure on the Executive Committee during a period that saw major revisions to the Council; a period that completely changed the entire organization. As an officer and member of the Executive Committee, Mr. Patnaude was directly involved in every change that was made. Major changes can be highlighted as follows:

- ° The offices of the Council were moved to the State Capitol.

- The priorities of the organization were revised to put heavy emphasis upon Legislative affairs.
- The Council assumed a new proactive stance; one that was predicated on action rather than reaction. This was a long term effort -- one that was supported and managed by Mr. Patnaude.
- The entire staff was changed. Personnel were employed to meet specific job descriptions in line with new Council priorities and activities. Mr. Patnaude was directly involved in this process.
- The Legislative Advocate long employed by the Council was replaced with a firm more suited to new priorities. Mr. Patnaude made the decisions that facilitated this change.

Besides his intimate roles in the facilitation of the above actions, Mr. Patnaude also was responsible for commencing a complete rewrite of Council Bylaws. He wrote the Bylaws, coordinated the incorporation process and served as the Founding President of the CCAIA Foundation, a 501C.3 non-profit corporation designed to give the Council more flexibility in acquiring grants and donations. He was instrumental in securing NEA Grant monies to support the CCAIA Design Conference. He was instrumental in establishing the Council magazine, "Architecture California," and set policies that would give the magazine the tools to make it a self-supporting entity.

Mr. Patnaude expanded the California Design Conference to include Oregon and Washington in 1982, the first step in a process that is designed to make the Conference a major Western United States function.

As President of the largest Regional organization of Architects in the United States, second in size only to the National AIA, Mr. Patnaude was a major party in the successful effort that saw to a compromise solution between the California Board of Architectural Examiners (BAE) and NCARB relative to National Architectural Licensing Examinations. He chaired the effort that brought final resolve to the problem. He was the leader of the California effort that saw the passage at the 1982 AIA Convention of the California Resolutions addressing the Nuclear Freeze issue, a National Associates Task Force and an NCARB monitoring group.

As Chair of the CCAIA Planning and Finance Committee, Mr. Patnaude, in concert with the Council Treasurer developed the planning document which set the budget and programs for the 1982 CCAIA year. Within this program was the establishment of a "California Council Design Awards Program" which was first held in 1982. This was a very successful effort and has become an important part of the Council's subsequent program.

Mr. Patnaude commenced a program to coordinate the efforts of the four National Directors with Board and Excom toward advocacy of Council issues at the National level. He established a process for developing official policies of the Council along with attendant methods of filing sunsetting and accessing.

As an officer of the Council, he was thoroughly and continuously involved in the successful effort to stop the Executive Branch of the State Government's efforts to eliminate the licensure of Architects within California. He was a part of efforts that established and maintained a Registration/Legislation Blue Ribbon Committee which provided a policy guide to the Council for registration efforts. He was a leader in the efforts that mobilized the profession in the State in its attack on State programs that threatened the licensure of the profession. He was a leader in the formation of the ARCPAC organization in California and continued through his Presidency his support of the PAC, an entity that raised far more money than the National AIA PAC. As President, he led legislative efforts aimed at eliminating the Building Designer Category and legislation that would have changed the makeup of the Board of Architectural Examiners, placing more professional members on the Board; that effort continues to this date.

Mr. Patnaude's efforts at the Council level have been consistent, and forceful, and have been over such a period of time that it can be truly said that the Council would not be the effective organization that it is today without his input. He has been a major force in the development of an organization representing over 5,000 members; an organization that is at the lead of State and Regional AIA entities.

Elected to the National AIA Board of Directors for a three (3) year term as a Director from California, Mr. Patnaude's term commenced in December 1982. During his first year on the Board he has served as a member of the Membership Services Commission. He was chair of the Library Task Force that presented the concept of establishing an Information Services Department in the Institute, a far reaching proposal designed to bring order to the Institute's Information Services to Members and the public. This concept has been accepted and the process has been started. He also served on the Task Force for Direction 80's implementation that studied the issues of the "Body of Knowledge," the need for a governance study and a component study. As part of his duties as Commissioner for the Affirmative Action Committee, the Minority Resources Task Group and the Women in Architecture Task Group, he negotiated and coordinated the effort that saw near a unanimous passage of a resolution at the 1983 Convention affirming and strengthening the role of the Affirmative Action program within the Institute.

2. Qualities of Design which have Contributed to the Advancement of the Profession

The office of Mr. Patnaude has been responsible for more award winning Architectural projects than any other in the San Joaquin Chapter Area. The standards of excellence have been continuous and consistent. Since 1975, three Design Awards Programs have been held in the Chapter Area. In each program, over 75 submittals were judged and in each of them the majority of the awards were won by Patnaude. During that period, no other firm received an "Award of Excellence," the highest award. Patnaude's office was the recipient of four, at least one in each Awards Program. Juries constituted of well-known Architects from outside the geographical area have been consistently and continuously complementary.

Mr. Patnaude practices in a conservative, agriculturally oriented community that does not encourage avant-garde solutions and is reluctant to spend large sums on monumental structures. Functioning within this environment has forced a specific type of building but has not forced poor design as a solution. A perusal of the photographs within this submission will show the level of design that has been attained.

Mr. Patnaude has been recognized for his work on historic structures and is acknowledged as a major local expert on their aesthetics and restoration or adaptation. Awards from Historical Societies attest to this recognition.

Specific structures that have received considerable attention outside the local area include (among others) the Fresno Air Terminal Concourse Addition and the TSPS Facility for the Telephone Company. The terminal structure was featured in FAA publications referencing excellence of design in terminal structures, it received National coverage in magazines, was a feature of a presentation at the CCAIA Design Conference and was used as an example of "Good Design is a Wise Investment" by the California Council, AIA in a statewide design awareness program. The TSPS Facility was featured in statewide television coverage and was studied and published throughout the Bell System as an example of an excellent solution to a difficult problem. The building was also, nationally published.

A recent award received by the firm recognized the Design Excellence of the Downtown Club project. This was a Statewide Design Competition for Historical Preservation projects completed from May 1976 to May 1983 and was one of only 14 awards given.

Mr. Patnaude and his office strive for design excellence continuously with an office policy established by Mr. Patnaude, that each building or project must be as good and as exciting as possible. The work has set a standard of excellence that is recognized by his peers and has become the reference for design excellence in the local area.
