Your letter of December 1st has been received, as well as letter of November 29th from Mr. Edward H. De Wolf, Secretary of the Central Valley Chapter of California, both with regard to the assignment of Kern County in California to the territory of the Southern California Chapter.

The reason for the reference of the application of Mr. William H. Paynter of Bakersfield to the Central Valley Chapter for approval of his possible assignment to the Southern California Chapter, was because according to the records I had available, Bakersfield, in Kern County, was indicated as being in the territory of the Central Valley Chapter.

Upon receipt of your letters, advising that Kern County is in the territory of the Gouthern California Chapter, I have referred this question to The Treasurer's Office, which has charge of maintaining records of chapter territories, and that Office reports to me that Kern County is in the territory of the Central Valley Chapter of California.

Since your Chapters' records and those of The Institute do not appear to be in agreement, we request that you notify us of the authority for the change which apparently has been made in your Chapters' records.

It was entirely permissible for Bakersfield architects to be assigned to the Southern Colifornia Chapter prior to the adoption of the amendment of the restricting by-law, inasmuch as previously an applicant could be assigned to the chapter of his choice within the State in which he maintained his legal residence or principal place of practice.

Kindly refer to your letter of December 8, 1954, in which you advise us that Kern County does not come within the territory assigned to the Southern California Chapter.

Upon receipt of your letter we immediately checked the files and find we concur that the area in question was assigned to the Central Valley Chapter by action taken in 1942. Please accept our apology.

Not having before had this situation brought so sharply to our attention, we have been "rolling along" under the admitted misapprehension. However, to our knowledge all of the practicing architects in Bakersfield (heart of Kern County) are members of our Chapter with the exception of one, and because of circumstances best known to these members they prefer to continue such membership. It is our understanding that the action taken on the subject by the Institute at Boston is not retroactive.

With special reference of the application of Mr. Paynter, we have been advised that he definitely desires membership in the Southern California Chapter and it is recalled that such an assignment can be made at the applicant's request to the Board of Directors.

Kindly inform us, as well as Mr. Paynter, in a letter the required action involved in making such a request.
