

Re: Tician Papachristou - Request for Transfer

We have had on file your letter to Mr. Papachristou of November 20th. Has he ever paid the dues to you?

If he hasn't, something should be done about his membership. Either the Chapter should recommend his membership termination for nonpayment of Chapter dues, or, you should consider the matter further and maybe waive a part of the dues and send him a revised statement.

You state in your letter that the Chapter has not carried his name on your rolls since 1967 and it is for that reason that we think an adjustment in his dues should be made. His name must have been dropped by mistake since we find no evidence of his membership ever being terminated, or transferred, or that a resignation from him was ever accepted by the National Secretary. Under the circumstances, how is he expected to pay chapter dues if he was not billed for them or even regarded by the chapter as a member? Of course, there may be more to this than meets the eye, but we have to be mainly concerned with the facts of his membership.

The problem we're faced with as the situation now stands is that he is a member of the Colorado Central Chapter regardless of whether or not the Chapter accepts that.

- (a) Tician Papachristou has made important contributions both to architecture and urban designating a career that spans twenty five years. He has also won distinction as an author and educator.
  - Mr. Papachristou received his formal training at Princeton where he earned both his B.A. (summa cum laude) and his M.F.A. He credits two men with having given discipline and foundation to his work: Jean Labatut, his teacher and mentor at Princeton and Marcel Breuer with whom he collaborated later on.

Tician Papachristou's work corresponds to the three phases of his professional career: the first decade, as principal in his own office in Colorado; the second decade, collaborating with Marcel Breuer as one of his partners in New York; and the last five years as a partner of MBA, the successor firm following Breuer's retirement.

- 1. From the beginning, in Colorado, Papachristou pursued his dual interest in architecture and planning. Eager to explore, he approached his early houses (about a dozen) as a series of personal interpretations, finding for each project its own idiomatic form, derived from the particulars of each client, program and site. Notable among these are the Wallbank House in Denver, honored with a Colorado Chapter AIA award, and the Newkirk House in Boulder. These and other houses of that time drew the early attention of local and national publications for their fresh and innovative approach. During this same period Papachristou was in the forefront of an early movement to revive the central city. In a series of significant projects he presented and published specific concepts for the Denver and Boulder downtown districts. Eventually, as a member of an AIA taskforce he made important contributions to the Downtown Denver Master Plan.
- 2. With Papachristou's decision in 1965 to leave Colorado and join Marcel Breuer in New York he began a completely new phase in his career. The years of successful collaboration with Breuer yielded several outstanding houses and important institutional campuses. Prominent among these is the Campus High School in Boston, a multi-building complex in the inner city district of Roxbury and a pace-setting response to an ambitious program that combined advanced social, educational and urban concepts. Mary College, in Bismarck, North Dakota, on the other hand, is a highly sophisticated version of the traditional college campus a close grouping of buildings set as an island in the open landscape, making its own environment of protected, internal courtyards.
- In recent years, Tician Papachristou has devoted much of his time to one major project. He participated in the planning and is the principal architect and urban designer for Sadat City, a new community for a population of 500,000, now under construction in the desert west of the Nile, half-way between Cairo and Alexandria. It is the crowning achievement of his career to date and combines his two principal interests of architecture and urban design. Papachristou's contribution to this vast project has been critical and pervasive. He influenced the basic concepts of the master plan by his vision of a tightly clustered, low-rise desert city appropriate to the Egyptian climate and economy. He established innovative housing standards and set the guidelines for the urban design of the business and government center. Finally, he applied these principles to the design of all of the city's first buildings almost an entire spectrum of urban architecture.
