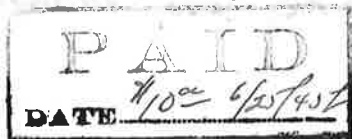

10. Other data concerning nominee's record.

The nominee began working in the office of John McCoy of Danville, Illinois, at the age of 16. He continued to work on Saturdays and during summer vacations all through the remainder of his high school and college life, being employed by several firms in Danville, Champaign and Chicago, Illinois.

He was a designer for Mundie and Jenson of Chicago, when he was offered the position of Instructor in Architecture at Oklahoma A & M College in the fall of 1917 and accepted the appointment.

While a member of the college faculty, he did a limited practice in partnership with F. W. Redlich.

In 1925 he resigned from his college post to accept the position as designer for Sanguinet, Stoats and Hedrick, of Fort Worth, Texas, later becoming a participating member of the successor firm, Wyatt C. Hedrick, Inc.

In 1932 he opened his own office and in 1934 formed the partnership of Patterson and Teague. In 1939 this partnership was dissolved and he formed a partnership with Edward L. Wilson under the firm name of Wilson and Patterson. In 1952 three associates were added, the firm becoming²Wilson, Patterson and Associates. The associates were made full partners in 1954 and the firm name is now Wilson, Patterson, Sowden, Dunlap and Epperly.

2. Describe nominee's notable work in design, to bring out the particular achievements the nominators believe have notably contributed to the advancement of the profession.

In the designing of the Fort Worth Children's Museum, the nominators feel that the nominee has contributed notably to the advancement of the profession of Architecture. This building, the first of its kind in the United States to be designed exclusively for a Junior Museum, required years of research and planning. Problems unique to this type of museum had to be solved. It has been commended by many Junior Museum authorities, including the founder of the Brooklyn Children's Museum, the first in the world. As the result of his work on this building, as well as for other research and planning done in collaboration with Director Wm. G. Hassler of the Fort Worth Children's Museum, and with Mr. John Ripley Forbes, of the Hornaday Foundation for Junior Museums, the nominee was appointed Consulting Architect for the Foundation in 1954.

Degree - Bachelor of Science in Architecture - University of Illinois - 1917.

The nominee became a member of the faculty of the Architectural Department of the Oklahoma A. and M. College in the fall of 1917. With the exception of time spent in army service, he remained there until the summer of 1925, advancing from the rank of Instructor to that of Associate Professor.

In the opinion of the nominators the best evidence of his influence in the field of architectural education is the fact that four of his former students became faculty members of their Alma Mater, now known as Oklahoma State University, and have played, and are still playing, notable roles in the advancement of its School of Architecture to the position of excellence and importance it now enjoys.

The nominee is still vitally interested in the field of education. He is now serving as the active director of the Architect-in-Training Program, the Fort Worth Chapter's major project.

Honorary and Professional Fraternities of which he is a member are: Phi Kappa Phi (Honorary Scholastic), Sigma Tau (Honorary Engineering), and Alpha Rho Chi (Professional Architectural).



This letter is in reference to the nomination of Mr. Joseph J. Patterson of Fort Worth, Texas, which has been filed with the Jury of Fellows by the Fort Worth Chapter, A.I.A., Fort Worth, Texas

It is the desire of the Executive Committee of the Chapter that Mr. Patterson's category be expanded to include Public Service. In support of this desire on the part of the Fort Worth Chapter, the following facts are submitted.

Early in 1961 Mr. Patterson instigated a program in the Fort Worth Chapter whose purpose was three-fold: First, to stimulate chapter activity in the study of civic problems; second, to identify the profession as leaders in a civic enterprise for which their training and ability peculiarly fitted them; third, to revive public interest in the re-development of Downtown Fort Worth.

Briefly, the program was conceived as a three-phase operation: First, a competition, open to all members of the chapter, in which each competitor would present anonymously his idea of the proper development of the central city; second, the presentation of the results of this competition before as many civic groups as possible; third, the actual preparation of a master plan, under the aegis of the City Planning Department, and using ideas gleaned from the competition and the constructive criticism of the civic groups.

The competition was a great success. Twenty-two solutions were submitted by 39 men, working individually or in teams, from 16 offices of the 24 connected with A.I.A.

Mr. Patterson, together with the Director of the City Planning Department, then presented these plans before a number of organized civic groups, explaining the problems involved and discussing the solutions submitted. In this way, as broad a base of interest as possible was created.

The plans, whose anonymity has been preserved, were then presented as a gift to the City Planning Department and chapter action was taken to provide a permanent committee to assist the Department, in every possible way, in the preparation of a Master Plan.

This unselfish action by a professional group was highly lauded by the press and by civic leaders. Special resolutions, copies of which are enclosed, were passed by the Downtown Fort Worth Association and the City Council, commending the Architects for their service and especially expressing their thanks to Mr. Patterson "for his outstanding work in organizing the entire program and properly motivating all participants."

Mr. Patterson is starting on his third year as the architect representative on the important Municipal Planning Committee of the Chamber of Commerce. He is also a member of the Master Design Team now engaged in the study of the central city's development for the City Planning Department.

We feel that Mr. Patterson's work and efforts in stimulating the cooperation of the chapter members and in gaining the support and respect of the various public authorities has been most helpful in promoting this worthwhile project. We therefore respectfully submit that he should be considered favorably for Fellowship in the category of Public Service.




