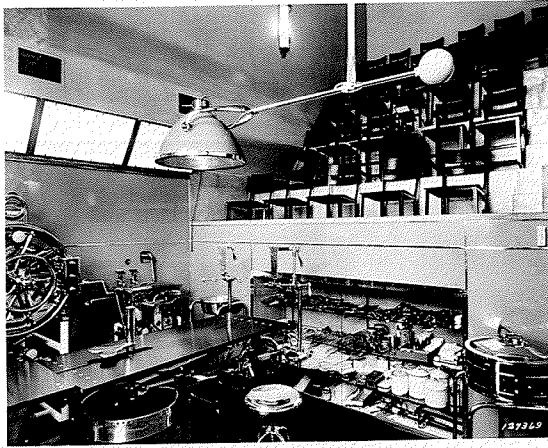

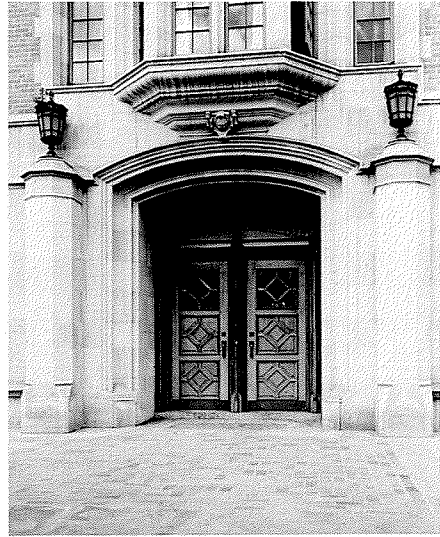

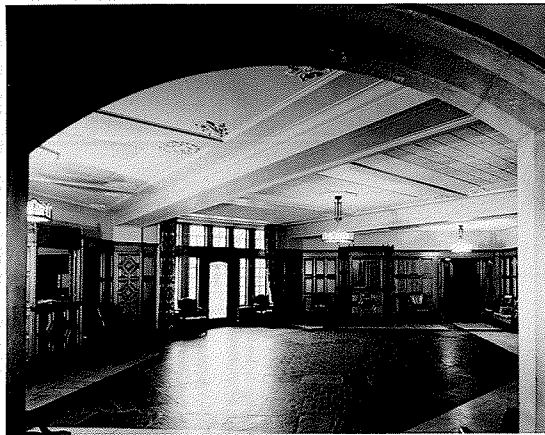
LIVING ROOM OWNER - UNIVERSITY OF MICHIGAN GIRLS DORMITORY



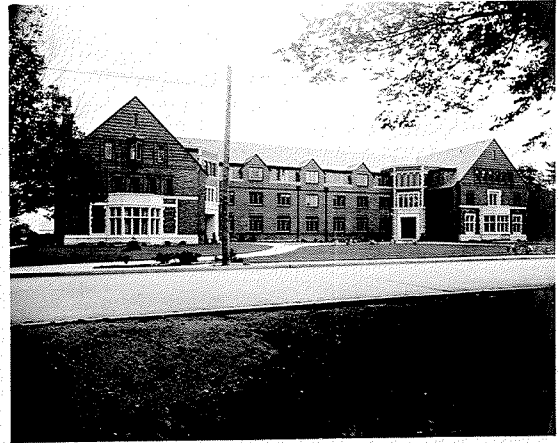

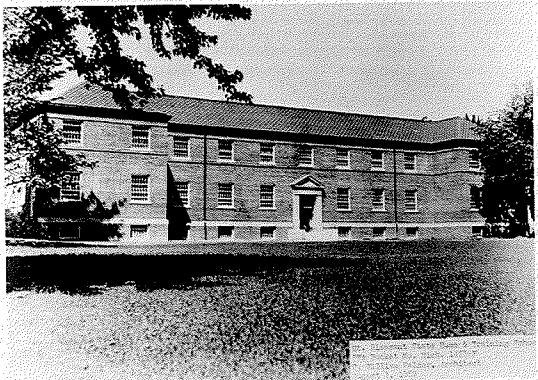


