The Architects' Roster is maintained by The American Institute of Architects as a service to the profession as a whole and to agencies of the United States Government. Every registered architect, whether or not a member of The Institute, is eligible for inclusion in the Roster. The Institute maintains custody of the Roster, keeps it up to date and in good order for use. The Roster is available to any representative of the Government and to representatives of foreign governments in Washington. Reference may be made to The Architects' Roster in negotiations with government agencies and other interested parties. Experience with the Roster since its establishment in 1946 has shown its usefulness. Growing out of an earlier Register of architects qualified for public works, The Roster provides at The Octagon an accurate, current record of the qualifications and achievements of members of the profession. It allows a positive and helpful response to requests for factual information on architects, and in that way constitutes a service to the profession.

The American Institute of Architects assumes no responsibility for the accuracy of statements made in this Questionnaire. The obligation to maintain this record as a current description of an architectural firm rests with the firm, and supplementary record forms are available for this purpose.

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WILLIAM W. PATTERSON

ARCHITECT

Status:

Mr. Patterson opened his offices in Danville, Virginia, for the practice of Architecture in February, 1940, and practiced in that city until September 1942, when he was inducted into the Army of the United States. He served in the Armed Forces for four years, being discharged in July 1946 with the rank of Captain in the Corps of Engineers. While in the Service, he attended the Engineers Officer Candidate School and was commissioned a Second Lieutenant in June 1943. Assigned to an Engineer Construction Battalion, he saw duty in the Pacific Ocean Areas for two years. His unit performed all types of General Construction work such as hospitals, Red Cross canteens, administrative buildings for various headquarters, roads, air strips, etc. He is now a Major in the Corps of Engineers, Inactive Reserves. After discharge, he re-opened his offices in Danville, but was associated with Pendleton S. Clark, Architect, of Lynchburg, Virginia, working on various projects such as the Lynchburg High School, Apartment Developments, Theatres, etc. In April 1947, he was commissioned as Architect for the proposed Student Activities Building for Stratford College, and returned to Danville to complete the preliminary site plans and studies for that institution. He went into partnership with Louis Ballou and Charles C. Justice, Architects of Richmond in August 1947. In December 1948 Offices were opened in Newport News, Virginia, to complete several projects under construction begun by the late Lyle Swiger, Architect. Both the Danville and Newport News offices have been operated by Mr. Patterson since that time. Negotiations were begun in October 1950 to dissolve the firm of Patterson, Ballou and Justice, Architects, the said firm to be dissolved by June 1951. Mr. Patterson purchased the interest of his partners, and has continued the practice of Architecture in Danville and Newport News since that time.

Education: He was graduated from the University of Virginia in 1937, receiving the degree of Bachelor of Science in Architecture. He also attended the University of North Carolina, and the Elliott O'Hara Summer School of Water Color Painting from 1934 to 1937.
