
Gentlemen:


Gentlemen:

Dear Mr. Granbery:

Thank you very much for your courtesy during our telephone conversation on Friday last.

When I opened the letter from the A.I.A. in Washington, D.C. regarding my transfer to the Connecticut Chapter, it came as a distinct shock that any member of the Connecticut Chapter could have preferred charges against me. And more of a shock that the members of the committee of the Connecticut Chapter of the A.I.A. would take the word of this one person without giving me a hearing which I feel I am entitled to.

With my business here in Connecticut now, I felt that I should be helping to support the Connecticut Chapter, so I asked for a transfer, only to find that my colleagues in this profession do not seem to want to associate with me. I have served on the Board of Directors in the Western Massachusetts Chapter for one year, and am sure that all of the members of that Chapter who know me and the way I practice architecture, are happy to have me stay on with them. However, since I think I know what has been said about me, I am afraid that we are confusing charity with ethics. I should like to be able to explain to the committee my side of the story.

In closing, I would like to quote a couple of words taken from this morning's gospel at our church, Luke 12, 1 - 8, "For what has been said in darkness will be said in light; and what you have whispered in the inner chambers will be preached on the housetops".

I enclose a carbon copy of a letter from another of our members which is intended for you. It poses something of a dilemma, so I again would like to ask for your comments. This falls also in Maureen Marx's Department, so would you please check with her also.

According to our records, Mr. Reinhardt became an AIA member in 1924, although he says 1945. I believe we took the 1924 date from the "American Architects Directory", and think it must be wrong. At any rate, he has been an AIA member for well over the requisite fifteen years for becoming a Member Emeritus. Could you have Maureen check his record there?


When I suggested to Mr. Reinhardt that he become a Member Emeritus at his 65th birthday, he was not interested because he could not do that unless he was retired. Now, what this brings to mind is, just what is the definition of "retirement" in the requirement for emeritus standing? I am sure you realize that there are all sorts of degrees of retirement, but I cannot find a Board ruling to use as a guide here.

Should I ask Mr. Reinhardt to fill out a form requesting emeritus standing, or should I request the Executive Committee of this Chapter to waive his dues? This requirement that a member be disabled or retired to become a Member Emeritus at 65, when he can be fully active and a Member Emeritus at 70 seems sort of pointless. I can't help but take note of my very active friend Walter Gropius, who at the age of 84 has a world-wide practice which he personally conducts as a part of The Architects Collaborative. I guess he hasn't paused long enough to realize he could be a Member Emeritus.


We are in receipt of your letter of November 27th inquiring about the procedures for eligibility for Member Emeritus.

This is in answer to your letter to Bill Wolverton of November 27th about Membership Emeritus and, more specifically, the case of Mr. Reinhardt.

We interpret the term "retired" to mean retired from active practice, or, at best, that a member applying for ME under this condition is not seeking new business.

If a member does not qualify under any of the conditions and cannot afford corporate dues their cases should be treated as regular hardship cases.

I don't think you ought to send Mr. Reinhardt an Application for Membership Emeritus because he states rather flatly that he is not "retired"; in fact, he is hoping that business will improve. We feel the Chapter may want to recommend waiver of his AIA dues in order that his membership will at least be preserved another year. In 1968, we can then take another look at his situation and see how it stands. Maybe he will be eligible then.

You can also elect him a Member Emeritus of the Chapter which will require no National approval or action.
