It allows a positive and helpful response to requests for factual information on architects, and in that way constitutes a service to the profession.

The American Institute of Architects assumes no responsibility for the accuracy of statements made in this Questionnaire. The obligation to maintain this record as a current description of an architectural firm rests with the firm, and supplementary record forms are available for this purpose.

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5. REMARKS CONCERNING QUALIFICATIONS OF FIRM

Reynolds, Smith and Hills maintains a well balanced organization, competent to handle within itself all but unusually highly specialized problems in the fields of architecture and engineering. Personnel have been carefully selected on the basis of demonstrated ability and experience in their respective fields. Key personnel are retained through non-productive periods in the belief that a high order of professional service requires both ability of individuals and a coordination of such abilities that can be developed only through continued association. Total personnel numbered 112 as of January 1953.

Services are available in the fields of architecture, mechanical engineering, electrical engineering, civil engineering, structural engineering and sanitary engineering.

Reynolds, Smith and Hills built, owns and occupies its own specifically designed building of offices and drafting rooms. The completely air conditioned building is fireproof construction, contains 12,500 sq. ft. of floor space divided approximately 8,500 sq. ft. on the first floor and 4,000 sq. ft. on the second floor. There are separate offices for all key personnel, two large drafting rooms, a fireproof vault for safeguarding plans in progress as well as for storage; and facilities for blueprinting and reproduction of plans and specifications. Attached hereto are photographs of the Jacksonville office showing an exterior view and interiors of the two drafting rooms.

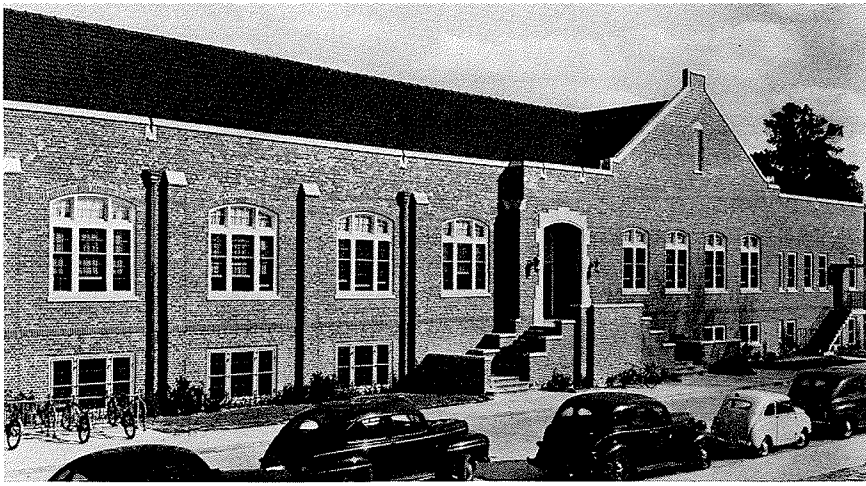


VIEW OF EAST WING
