

Chester E. Nagel, FAIA, a Falmouth, Mass. resident since 2000, died June 18<sup>th</sup>, 2004 at Falmouth Hospital at the age of 93. Mr. Nagel was born in Fredericksburg, Texas on April 5, 1911 to Emil Nagel and Lina Karger Nagel. He was predeceased by his brothers Gilbert Nagel of Fredericksburg, Texas and Ernst Nagel of Boerne, Texas and his sister Gretchen Nagel Enderlin of Fredericksburg, Texas

He studied architecture at the University of Texas, graduating in 1934. From 1935 to 1938 he worked as an architect for the National Park Service, helping to design facilities for the Bastrop and Palo Duro State Parks in Texas.

He studied at the Harvard Graduate School of Design under Walter Gropius and Marcel Breuer. After receiving his Master's degree from Harvard in 1940, he returned to Austin and, inspired by Gropius' ideas, designed one of the first International Style structures in the state, a house for himself and his wife. He was among the first architects to bring the International Style to Texas.

During WWII, Mr. Nagel was assigned to the Army Corps of Engineers from 1943 to 1945 worked as a test engineer on the Convair B-36 bomber in Ft. Worth. In 1946, he returned to Harvard assist Gropius and later became an Assistant Professor at the Harvard Graduate School of Design. He left teaching in 1951 to join The Architect's Collaborative (TAC) and from 1951 to 1953 he headed the TAC office in Washington, DC. Nagel's designs, many of which were collaborative ventures with Walter Gropius, included the Valley House in Lexington, Massachusetts (1940), the Overholt Thoracic Clinic in Boston (1955), and the American Embassy in Athens (1956). In 1958, he opened his own practice in Cambridge, Massachusetts and over the next decade designed projects in Florida, Puerto Rico, and the Virgin Islands as well as several buildings for the Harvard medical and dental schools. He was a lifelong friend of the architect IM Pei who invited him to the opening of Pei's restoration of the Louvre Museum in Paris in 1989.

Mr. Nagel also taught and lectured at Williams College, MIT, the University of Texas and at the University of Colorado in Boulder and in Denver where he was Visiting Professor of Architecture. He was always fond of gardening, mineral collecting, and the Boston Red Sox.

His beloved wife of 51 years, Lorine White Nagel, died in 1999. He is survived by daughters Ann Nagel Stone in Falmouth, Mass. and Susan Nagel-Stewart in Colorado Springs, Colorado as well as 3 grandchildren, Debra Stone, Michael Stone and Sarah Nagel-Grippin.
