

Forgive me for not addressing you by name and for my delay in writing you. Life sort of ganged up on me for a while, but I guess I have things in control.

Juliet Peddle was born on June 7, 1899.

She graduated from the University of Michigan in 1922.

She also studied at the Art Institute in Chicago and in Berkshire, Mass.

She worked in Chicago, doing architectural drafting, design, perspectives, full-sized details and checking shop drawings. --two years

She spent 6 months in Europe, sketching important architecture.

Worked in Chicago office of Edwin Clark, well-known Illinois architect.

Great Depression -- worked with the Historical American Buildings Survey sponsored by the federal government

1939 -- opened own office in Terre Haute

January 1943 -- December 1948 employed in the engineering department of Commercial Solvents Corp. There she did drafting work and pioneered work ~~in the~~ doing three-dimensional perspective drawings. She designed the animal research building, with a unique functional design.

1945 Opened own office, while continuing part time work at CSC

1956-57 -- Designed Medicenter -- featured in The Practical Builder, July, 1959

Her primary work was home design, both for the wealthy and the average citizen, both original and remodeling. Nothing was too small to do her best work.

Juliet had broad interests. The Sunday Tribune-Star printed a weekly column, featuring old houses and buildings in Vigo County -- 66 sketches and comments. She was active in the Historical Society, being editor of their monthly bulletin for 29 years. She was superintendent of the First Congregational Church Sunday school, was an inspiring Sunday School teacher and above all practiced her religion. As Dr. Herman Moench, Senior Vice-president of Rose Hulman, said " Her planning was very economical in all aspects. She was a very sturdy and fine person." And as a friend of mine who built the Crawford School said, " Her plans were the most complete of any architect I have worked under. And she was always available for consultation. If she could not make it one day, she was there early the next day."

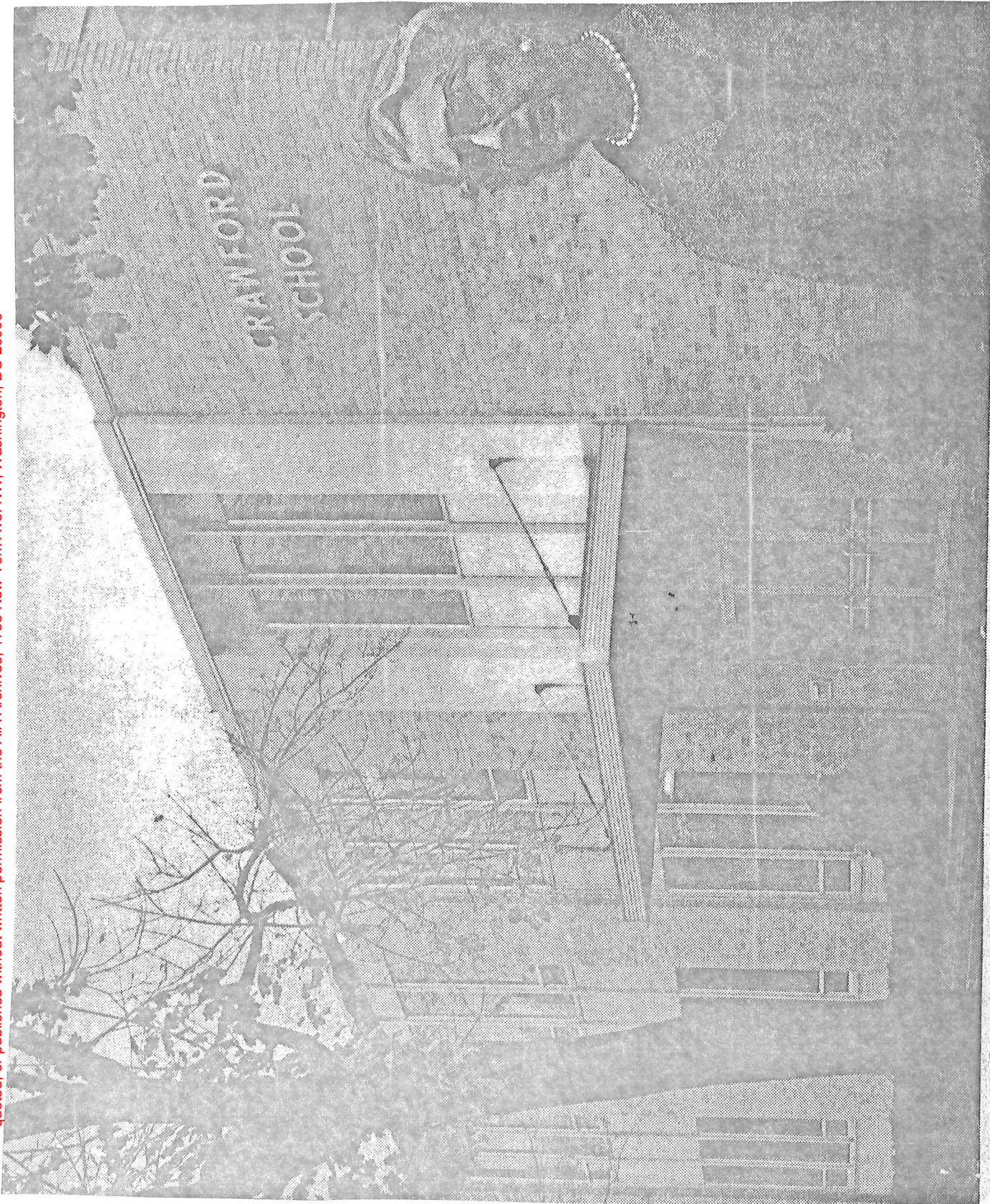
