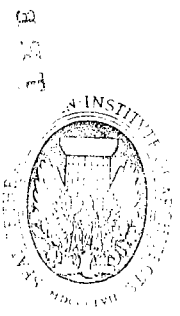

Dear Mrs. Marx:

Our records indicate that Mr. James E. Shelley has not been a member of this Chapter for at least two years or rather he has not attended a meeting for at least two years since he moved away from the Chapter area. Originally, it was my understanding that Mr. Shelley went from DeLand to the Central Florida Chapter and from there back to the Jacksonville Chapter. The records for 1963 and 1964 are not in my possession but as I recall, action was taken at one Executive Committee Meeting releasing Mr. Shelley to the Central Florida Chapter.

If Mr. Shelley was never officially released to another Chapter or assigned to another Chapter by the Institute, I assume all it would take would be a Resolution from the Daytona Beach Chapter Executive Committee allowing Mr. Shelley to resign from this Chapter. Please advise.

Regarding Membership Procedures, we have one of our members, Mr. G. M. Peek in DeLand, who has not been able to attend A.I.A. meetings for approximately two years. Since he will be sixty-six years old next January, he is asking if there is some permanent status that he might attain from the Daytona Beach Chapter without jeopardizing his status as a Corporate Member of the Institute. As Mr. Peek has been in poor health for several years, this Chapter is willing to go along with any recommendation that the Membership Procedures will allow us to and I think perhaps if he can be an unassigned member of the Institute, his problem would be solved. Since his dues are paid, both locally and nationally, he is a member in good standing and whatever recourse we have should be made immediately.

I received a letter from your Asst. Manager, Mrs. Golato, regarding the membership status of Mr. G. Medwin Peek.

Perhaps the last paragraph of my letter did not make clear that Mr. Peek desires to retain his A.I.A. membership and still practice architecture on a limited basis. His reason for not being able to attend Chapter meetings is that he has been in poor health for the last several years and has not been able to attend evening meetings in Daytona Beach which is some twenty miles from his home in DeLand. Dear Mr. Gerken:

Thank you for your recent letters about James E. Shelley and G. M. Peck.

There is nothing in our files which would indicate that Mr. Shelley is assigned to a Chapter other than yours. The Daytona Beach Chapter may therefore do as it chooses, either recommend waiver of the past dues which would enable us to accept his resignation as a member in good standing; or let the matter ride in which event we will terminate while indebted around October 13th - unless, of course, he pays. In case you do recommend that his resignation be accepted in good standing, please advise us also if you wish to admit him as a Professional Associate.

The Chapter may waive Mr. Peck's dues without Institute approval or action, unless Institute dues were also involved. Perhaps this would be the best way to handle it since it would eliminate some of Mr. Peck's financial burden and enable him to retain full Institute rights until he is eligible to apply for Membership Emeritus. Such action might be subject to the approval of FAA, AIA, depending on the dues structure and the manner in which they are paid to the Chapters and State Organization in Florida. It should be understood, however, that if his dues are waived, he would still remain assigned to your Chapter on record.



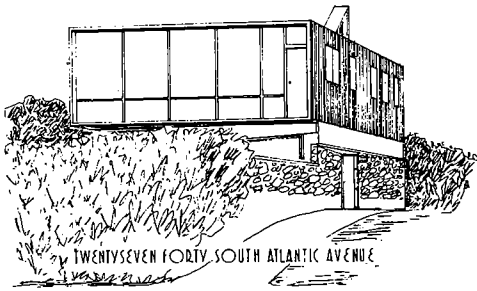

### Gouverneur Peek

From Our West Volusia Bureau

DELAND—Gouverneur Medwin Peek, 79, the architect who designed DeLand City Hall, died Wednesday at a local nursing home here. He had lived in DeLand since 1908.

Peek, a native of Palatka, was for many years the only architect in this city. During the mid-1920s, he used Mediterranean lines in designing the 50 year old City Hall building. He also designed Fish Memorial Hospital, the district Department of Transportation building and was an associate architect for the College Arms apartment building, this city's highest building.

A graduate of Harvard, Peek was sent to Egypt in 1925 and 1935 to make drawings of tombs there for the Metropolitan Museum of Art in New York City. He retired in 1973.

Peek, who lived at 930 N. Florida Ave., was a member of the American Institute of Architects, a veteran of World Wars I and II, and a member of St. Barnabas Episcopal Church. He is survived by his widow, Ellen T.; a stepson, a stepdaughter and seven grandchildren. Allen-Summerhill is in charge.
