



Bernard Pepinsky has never ceased to grow in esteem as an architect and he has always epitomized what we talk about so endlessly as the practice of architecture - in the correct and fullest sense of the meaning of the terms. He has a delicately balanced feeling of design and construction within the economical limits set up by the client, resulting in the fact that third generation clients are still returning to him for architectural service.

He has a keen grasp of the clients requirements and can transpose these requirements quickly into a beautifully integrated, well designed plan. This quick grasp of the clients needs is not peculiar to any particular category of buildings, but runs the gamut of all types of building from small residential work to large monumental work.

It is firmly believed that this talent is solely responsible for his many clients over the years being completely sold on him as an outstanding representative of the architectural profession.
