Dear Mr. Schiller:

On behalf of Secretary Ditchy, I am responding to your inquiry of February 13th concerning the application of Mr. Jerome W. Perlstein for corporate membership.

Mr. Perlstein's election was completed effective February 5, 1953, and on that date letter was sent to him and the usual notices to you as chapter secretary, together with the lists of all elected members as of that date, and the notice of pending applications being held for later consideration.

Perhaps you have received that package by now. In case something has happened to it, we are sending duplicates herewith.

We do owe Mr. Perlstein and the Queens Chapter an apology for the delay in completing the election.

When the application was received, it needed an additional payment of \$5.00 to comply with the dues scale then in effect, about which we wrote to Mr. Perlstein, on August 19, 1952. The application was put forward and all further actions were completed, but we held up final election until the \$5.00 was received.

Apparently, Mr. Perlstein sent in the check in September without a letter of transmission, and the check went to The Treasurer's Office where it was properly recorded and deposited. However, that office overlooked notifying The Secretary's Office that the check had arrived which would have permitted prompt completion of the election.

The non-receipt of this payment was checked several times with The Treasurer's Office without success in disclosing its arrival, until late in January when it was found to have been received. Thereupon, Mr. Perlstein's election was completed with the next group - as of February 5th.

If Mr. Perlstein has not received the formal notice of his election, ask him to let us know and another will be sent to him.
