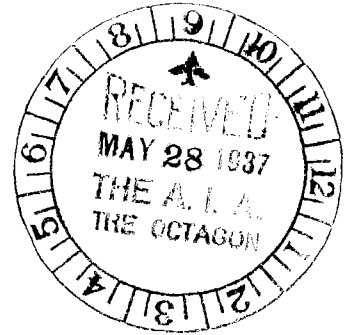

As soon as these exhibits are received, The Secretary will do everything he can to expedite its progress.

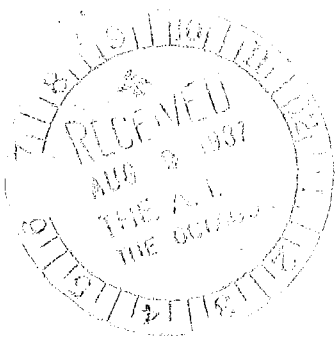

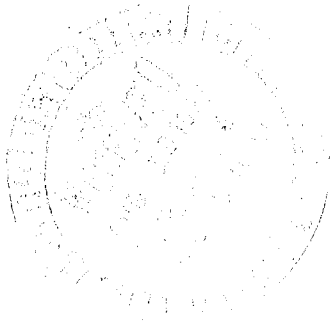


