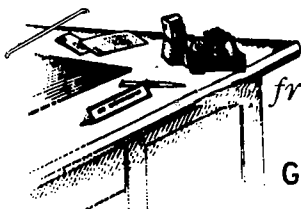
GEORGE W. PETTICORD, JR., A. I. A.

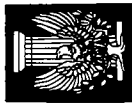
