Gentlemen:

Referring to your circular letter of April 15, 1946, concerning your Architects' Roster.

I am registered as an Architect in the State of Washington; however, I am employed full time by the Chicago, Milwaukee, St. Paul and Pacific Railroad Co. as Assistant Engineer, supervising engineering and maintenance of tracks, bridges and buildings on the Idaho Division. This embraces work handled by local contractors as well as company forces. Occasionally during my spare time I do professional architectural work for others, but this is not extensive.

In view of the circumstances, I would appreciate listing in your roster as an architect in the employ of the Milwaukee Road and not soliciting professional work in the usual sense.

Under "10. Collaboration with Junior Architects," I note you are asking for information that will help junior architects further their professional careers. If occasion arises, I will be glad to consider a professional association with some architectural firm instead of my present employment. I am a graduate of the class of 1925 in Architectural Design from the Massachusetts Institute of Technology, 42 years old, married, with one 10-year old daughter, and willing to consider professional work either in the United States or abroad.

This is mentioned as a matter of information as I have been considering establishment of an architectural office here at Spokane.
