2. Describe nominee's notable work in design, to bring out the particular achievements the nominators believe have notably contributed to the advancement of the profession.

Robert Billsbrough Price, A.I.A., has, since the start of his practice in Tacoma, Washington in 1949 to this date, constantly demonstrated an exceedingly high degree of architectural design skill far above the normal. This excellence in design is so outstanding, the sponsors feel nomination for Fellowship in Design is richly deserved by Robert Billsbrough Price, A.I.A..

In addition to being a designing architect of exceedingly high talent and ability, Mr. Price has done extensive research in the use of wood and plywood in new and unusual ways that have brought upon him the respect and admiration of the lumber industry. The Forest Products Industry, the West Coast Lumbermen's Association, as well as the American Plywood Association (formerly Douglas Fir Plywood Association) have all recognized Robert Billsbrough Price's contribution in the Science of Wood Construction.

Notable work includes the H.F. Hunt Junior High School Cafetorium, a 170 foot clear span wood domed cafetorium building; and the H.F. Hunt Junior High School Gymnasium, a plywood barrel vaulted structure on which Mr. Price designed the vaults, had the vaults tested to destruction, and obtained Code approval.

The Nell Hoyt Primary School, also recognized for research in design and construction, was the result of Douglas Fir Plywood Association's Research Project "Schools of the Future". Mr. Price designed the dome, had a mock-up built and loaded, and obtained Code approval for a new and radical roof design. Mr. Price also developed a plywood folded plate for the same project at a time a plywood folded plate was in its infancy.

These projects embodied new engineering and design uses of wood products developed by Mr. Price through his design ingenuity; and testing these methods proved successful and established new methods that are now commonly used in the architectural profession and construction industry.

The wood industry honored Mr. Price by appointing him to design the Forest Products Display Theatre at the Seattle World's Fair.

Sherman Elementary School, built in 1954, was the first school built in the United States to employ prestressed concrete structural elements. In order to obtain approval to build, authorities required Mr. Price to have prototype members cast and loaded to prove his calculations. Since that date, prestressed and precast members have become commonplace in the construction industry.
