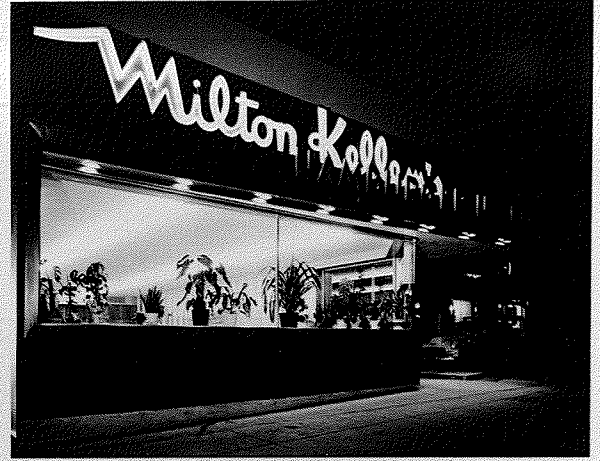

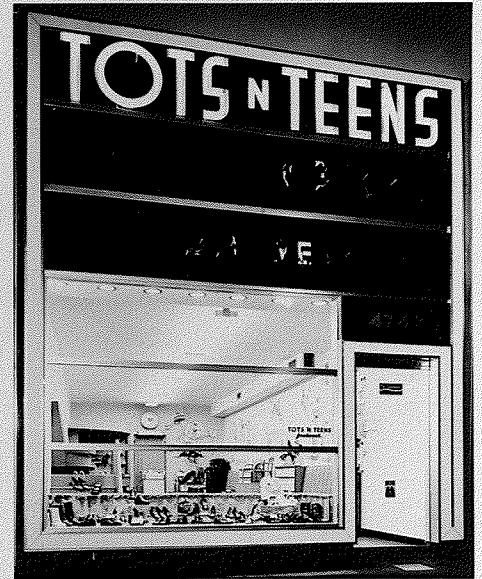
FRONT ELEVATION - BUTEN'S PAINTS STORE - 434 KENNEDY AVENUE, BOSTON, MA.

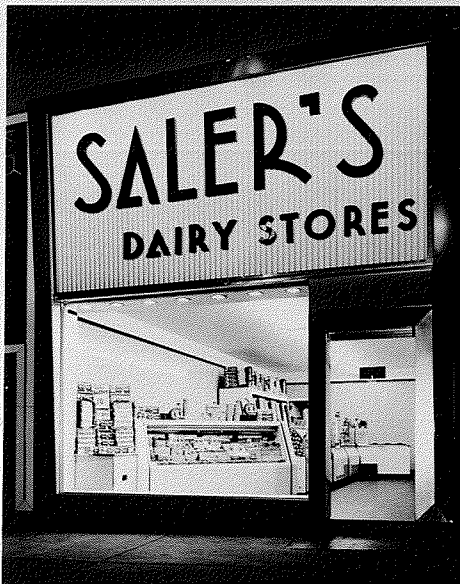
FRONT ELEVATION - MILTON HELLER'S RESTAURANT - 4746-48 SPRUCE ST., PHILA., PA.

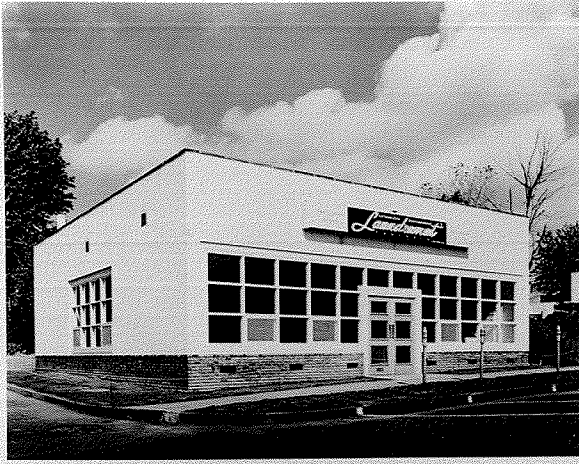

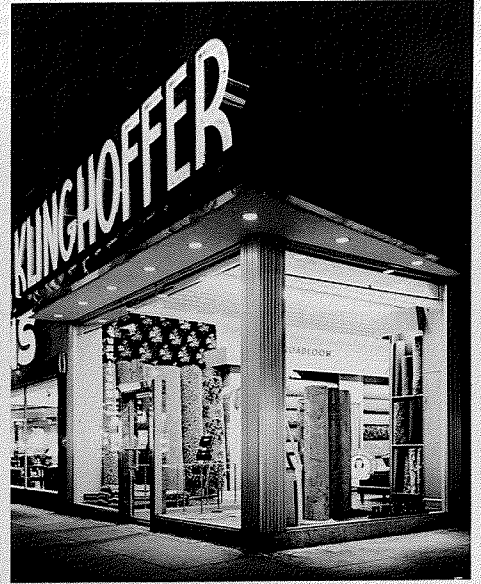
FRONT ELEVATION - SALER'S DAIRY STORES - 434 KENNEDY AVENUE, BOSTON, MA.

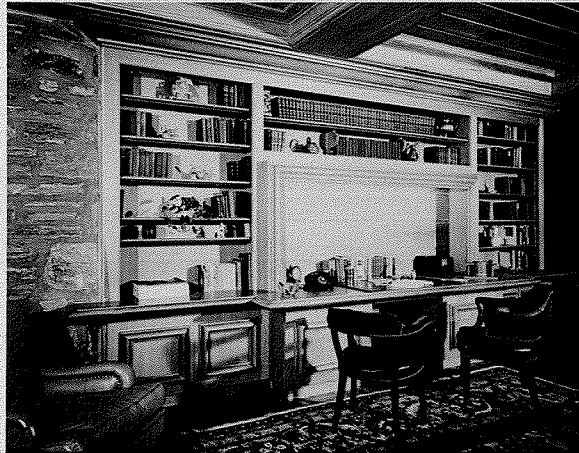

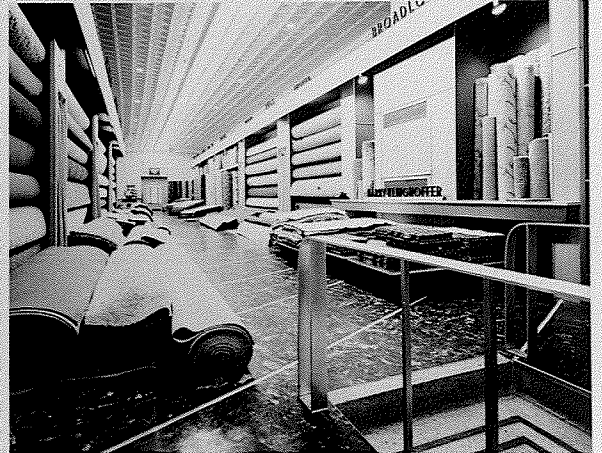
EXTERIOR ELEVATION-WITZMANN'S CLUB BUILDING, BALTIMORE, MD.

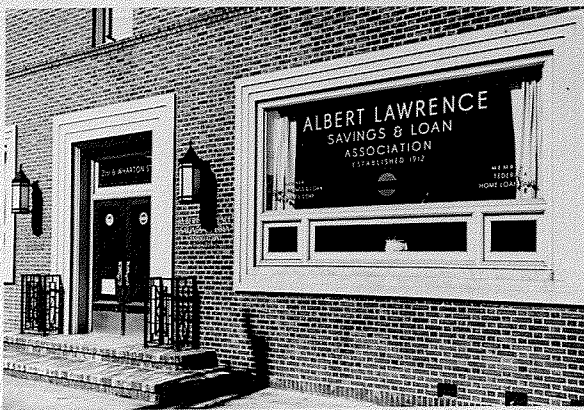
EXTERIOR ELEVATION-KINGHOFFER CLUB BUILDING, BALTIMORE, MD.

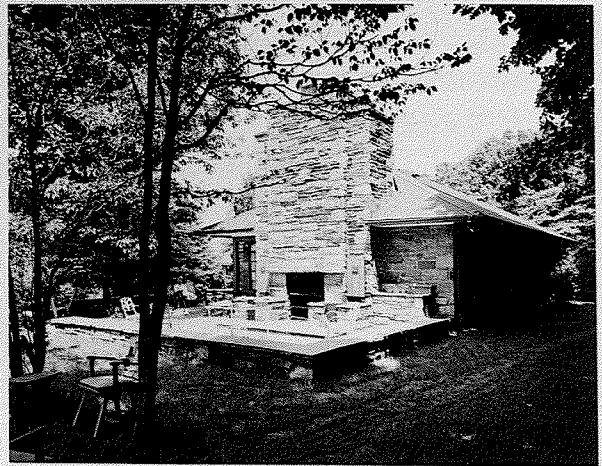
LIVING ROOM LOOKING TOWARD LIBRARY - WITZMANN'S CLUB BUILDING

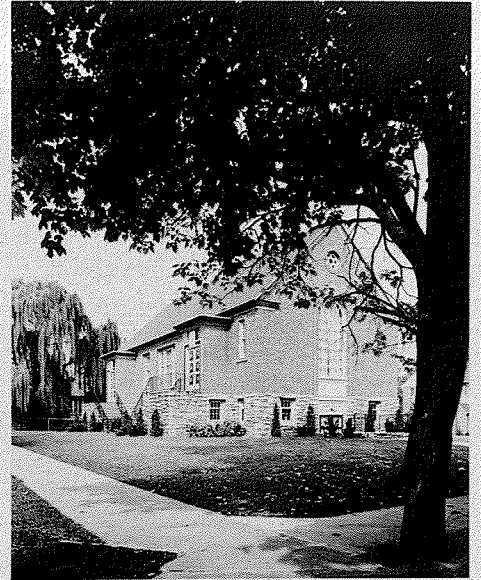

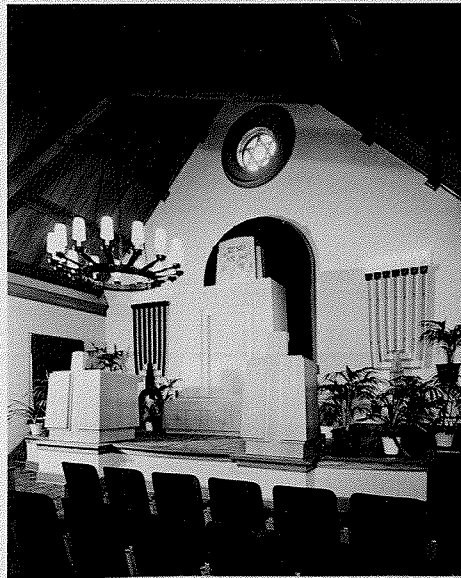

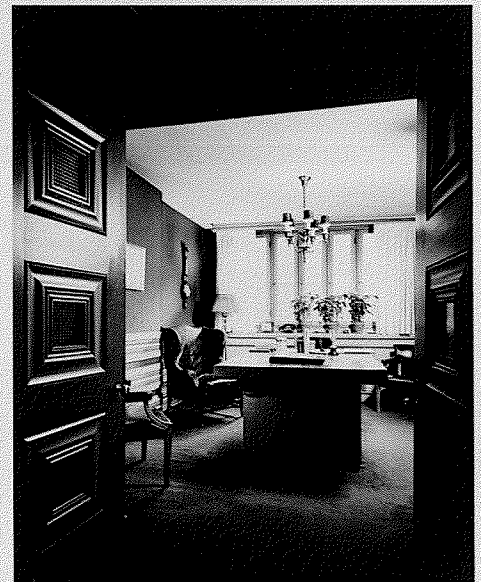
