

Dear Mr. Ross:

This is in answer to your letter of July 17 about the dues owing the Washington-Metropolitan Chapter. We are sorry we didn't make it clearer to you earlier.

A membership can be terminated by resignation, death, termination for nonpayment of AIA dues, termination for nonpayment of component dues, or for unprofessional conduct.

A member remains assigned to his chapter, and his dues obligation continues, regardless of whether he moves from his chapter's territory, until his membership in the AIA is terminated by one of the foregoing ways, or unless he requests and is granted a transfer in chapter assignment. (With particular reference to the dues, he may be excused from paying only if they are duly waived.)

According to our records, you were admitted to membership in 1966 and assigned to the Washington-Metropolitan Chapter until April, 1969, when your membership was terminated at the request of the Chapter for nonpayment of 1968 Chapter dues. There is nothing on file that would indicate that you asked to resign or have your dues waived.

A requirement for reinstatement is that the applicant is not indebted to either the AIA or his former chapter. In her letter of December 31, 1969, the ~~then~~ Executive Secretary, Joan Milstead, advised that you were in arrears for past dues (which, of course, was the cause for your membership termination in April of that year.) If you do not feel you should be held liable for them, or if you do not intend to pay them, the best thing to do is ask the Chapter's Executive Committee to consider waiving them, giving your reasons for such request.

We hope this answers your questions and that the matter will be resolved soon.

Gentlemen:

I thank you very much for your letter of July 23, 1970, in which you explained in detail the various ramifications of the dues requirement for chapter membership. You indicate in this letter that it is possible to request the Executive Committee for a waiver and I would like to do so based on the following statement.

I departed Washington, D.C., in June of 1966, being a member in good standing of the Washington-Metropolitan Chapter. My work overseas consisted of engineering and architectural work in direct support of the U.S. Military effort in Southeast Asia. After one and a-half or two years there it began to be apparent that it would be a long time, if ever, before I returned to Washington, D.C., and inasmuch as I was unaware that one could be demitted only by request, I merely allowed my membership in the Metropolitan Chapter to lapse.

Incidentally, I might point out that it is not clear, certainly not to me and probably to a great many other people too, that you cannot be a member at large of the AIA. This was never pointed out to me in any literature or communications from the organization. It seems to me that there are a great many people who might be in the circumstance in which I found myself, notably of being desirous to continue membership in the AIA, but seeing no particular reason for being associated with any particular local chapter. I think that this is a subject which might well be considered by the Executive Committee for future use. I might suggest that the Executive Committee make a resolution to make it possible that vagabond members of the architectural profession be allowed to maintain a membership at large during their travels and not require that they pay local dues. I might point out that in my case and in the case of others in a similar condition, the requirement to belong to a local chapter in which one is not active constitutes a very large financial burden which, although it might be acceptable to a working corporation, it is nonetheless a burden on an individual.


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I was overseas for four years and upon my return to the United States I took up residence in Omaha, Nebraska, and immediately applied for membership in the local chapter. I think this clearly indicates my desire to remain and to be in the future a member of the AIA. However, as I mentioned before, I do feel that my past dues obligations to the Washington-Metropolitan Chapter should be waived in this instance and I also suggest that you consider carefully my remarks concerning membership at large.

I want to thank you very much for the opportunity to present this statement and I hope it will have some salutary effect on the Executive Committee.


Gentlemen:
