We have received your letters dated June 12th regarding the memberships of Messrs. Robert Scott Geeting and Cliff Stanfield.

We are proceeding to terminate the membership of Mr. Stanfield, in accordance with his request. You will be notified in the near future when the termination is finally in effect.

May we take this opportunity to inform you that there is a difference in a resignation and a termination. It is not possible to resign when a member is owing for dues. For this reason we are unable to accept Mr. Geeting's resignation at this time in view of his owing for dues to the chapter for the first quarter of 1962. Since his letter of resignation is dated in April, The Institute is now requiring that any dues for 1962 be paid; therefore, as far as The Institute's concerned his resignation can be accepted as soon as chapter approval is received.

Under the circumstances the chapter may waive his dues in arrears; request that he pay the dues to permit us to accept his resignation; or The Institute can terminate his membership while owing for chapter dues at his request. Please let us know what course of action we should take.

Gentlemen:

Please inform me if it is possible to belong to the National AIA without having membership in the local chapter.

The AIA Journal and AIA Contract Documents have been valuable to me. I live in a city of 20,000 approximately 30 miles north of San Diego, California. I have a one man office and shall continue to due so.

I have no desire to use AIA after my name. It has haad the effect of destroying my individual identity and of encouraging clients whose primary objective is profit, not architecture, to shop and pressure for lower fees on the basis that all AIA's are equal in capability and service. Since using Architect only after my name, I have not had to contend with fee cutting and have established a clientel which I feel has been based on my individual ability.

I would like to retain membership in the National AIA in the belief that it basically advances the practice of the profession.

If the one man office is obligated to play golf, attend cocktail parties and pretend to be a business man (which I am not), then all individuals will eventually be alienated from the AIA. This would be a tragedy.



On February 18th, we were advised of the acceptance of the resignation of our former member, Robert Scott Geeting of Escondido, California, and termination of his membership.

Mr. Geeting submitted his resignation in 1962, which was forthwith sent to the Institute, but since there was an unpaid balance on his Chapter dues, the Institute did not accept the resignation. Mr. Geeting has now expressed some interest in rejoining the A.I.A., and has inquired as to the procedure, particularly with refernece to the amount of dues still owing.

The Chapter is uncertain if dues accrued during the time his resignation was held in abeyance; ie., to be reinstated would he be required to pay only the dues in arrears up to the date of his resignation (April 1962), or did they accrue for the balance of 1962, all of 1963 and so far in 1964 to February 18th, 1964.

Your letter regarding the status of Robert Scott Geeting has been received.

Since action on his termination was made retroactive to January 1, 1963, all he is owing in the way of back dues is 1962 Chapter dues.
