My dear Mr. Geiger:

We are in receipt of correspondence from the office of the Florida Chapter with regard to your non-payment of dues to the Chapter.

It appears that your indebtedness to the Florida Chapter has been overlooked to such an extent that the Chapter is forced to bring the matter to the attention of the Institute. We find here that your Institute dues have been paid to the end of the current year, therefore it would be unfortunate if the Executive Committee of the Institute were obliged to take action terminating your Institute membership because of the non-payment of Chapter dues.

The Executive Committee however has little choice for it is an established rule that the Institute and Chapter membership of the man who does not pay his Chapter dues after reasonable notice should be discontinued. It is unfair that those who pay should bear the burden of those who do not pay.

There will be a meeting of the Institute Board of Directors on May 14, just a week from today, and at that time your non-payment of dues to the Florida Chapter will be considered.

I am sure this situation has been overlooked and that you do not wish to sever your connection with your professional societies. If you will send a check or make other satisfactory arrangement with Miss Ida Bush Ryan the Treasurer of the Florida Chapter of 240 So. Orange Avenue, Orlando, Fla., or if she or you will telegraph this office by next Monday, the 14th, to that effect the incident will be considered as past history.
