SECTION 16. — At any time within one year after this Act becomes effective, upon application therefor and the payment of the registration fee of twenty-five dollars (\$25), the proper division of the Board shall issue a certificate of registration, without oral or written examination, to any architect or professional engineer who shall submit under oath evidence satisfactory to the proper division that he is of good character, that he has been a resident of the State of Missouri for at least one year immediately preceding the date of his application, that he was practicing architecture or professional engineering prior to the time this Act becomes effective, and that he has had responsible charge of work of important character. After this Act shall have been in effect one year, the Board shall issue certificates of registration only as provided for in Section 14 hereof.

Dear Mr. Geis:

According to the provisions of a Bylaw change voted by delegates to the 1972 AIA Convention, any member who fails to pay the entire amount of his regular and/or supplemental dues for the current year on or before June 30 must be considered in default, and notified of impending termination. This also applies to members who have paid their regular dues but who have failed to report that they are not liable for supplemental dues when this is the case.

The Bylaws provide that the membership of any member who is in default for nonpayment of dues as of August 31 must be terminated, provided that the member has been notified in writing by the secretary at least 30 days prior to the termination action. After August 31, in order to be reinstated in 1974, it will be necessary to pay not only the dues in arrears, but also a reinstatement fee of \$48.00. (\$53.00 after January 1, 1975)

Our records, which reflect dues payments received through June 30, 1974 show your 1974 dues as still unpaid. If you believe these records to be in error, please reply at once to the Office of the Controller, The American Institute of Architects, 1735 New York Avenue, N. W., Washington, D. C. 20006.

The invoice(s) enclosed indicates that you have either not responded to previous notices, or that you have not paid regular or supplemental dues. The deadline for receipt of these payments is August 31, 1974.

While this letter will serve as the required notice of impending termination, I hope you will treat it as a reminder, and that you will send your check along with the enclosed invoice right away. Your membership is valuable to the Institute, and I know that your officers and directors join me in hoping that you will be able to maintain it without interruption.
