



Dear Mr. Georgeson:

I'm replying air mail to your wire of December 14 concerning the application of the Salary Stabilization Act to recompensation of your employees. The information you have submitted appears quite complete, but unfortunately, without having the contract before me, it would be impossible to hazard a guess as to the extent to which you are able to pay your employees as agreed. In a general way, the information we have is that if you are obliged by a binding contract to pay compensation of a certain amount -- as a salary plus a fixed percentage of the profits in a given year-then you are obligated to do so and the Salary Stabilization Act cannot prohibit you from fulfilling this contractual responsibility. This appears to be the case on the basis of the facts set forth in your wire and whether the duties of your two associated architects were increased or whether the profits for 1951/are higher than those for 1950 does not effect the fact that you are legally obligated to pay them for their services according to the terms of your agreement. If these payments are in accordance with the contract, they are contractual payments and not a bonus, as defined by the Wage Stabilization Board. Hence, they are not subject to the limitations on the payment of bonuses as set forth in our item in the current "Memo from the Octagon."

The regional office of the Salary Stabilization Board in San Francisco would be the nearest available center of current information, but a note to the Salary Stabilization Board here in Washington would provide your office or your attorney with the most recent releases on the subject. Since these are constantly subject to change, I regret that we cannot be of servicetto you in this connection ourselves. You realize also that while we are able to give information, we cannot provide legal advice on matters of this sort.
