William J. Geddis, AIA, Executive Director and Vice President of The Architects Collaborative Inc. (TAC) of Cambridge, Mass. has worked on many major projects at TAC since he joined the firm in 1958 as an Associate.

He manages overall operations and coordinates project development both in the USA and abroad. He is a highly competent, committed Architect who is "Action oriented". From the design point of view, the Nauset Regional High School for which he was co-Principal, recently received a citation from the American Association of School Administrators.

He has found time to serve the Institute and Profession well, by Chairing the Internship and Licensing Committee for two years and as General Chairman of the 1970 Host Chapter Boston Convention, to mention a few. His efforts in coordinating sixteen different committees, planning for the Convention, and his fund raising efforts, not only unified the Boston Society, but kept it financially viable. He was elected President of the NCARB in June of 1970 and has been highly successful in effecting drastic changes of our archaic licensing laws and examinations.

In his community of Brookline he is Chairman of the Planning Board since 1966 and an active member since 1959.
