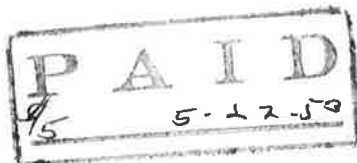

Mr. Panciera has referred to this office your letter dated February 7th for reply.
