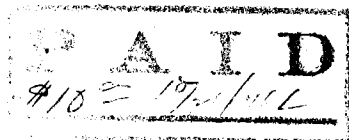





Dear Mrs. Ericsson:

Your letter of October 26th concerning a possible inactive type of membership in The A.I.A. is received.

There is a type of membership called Membership Emeritus, whereby a member retains all rights and privileges of active corporate membership, while being exempted from payment of Institute and chapter dues. However, one of the requirements for this change in status is that the member must have 15 years of membership in The Institute; also that the member is 70 years of age or 65 years, retired and not engaged in the practice of architecture; or that he is unable to engage in any gainful vocation. If you feel that you qualify under requirements A, B, or C, kindly fill in the form and forward it to your chapter and perhaps it will want to waive the 15 years of membership requirement, since you were elected in 1946 and have not completed 15 years of membership.

If you do not feel you qualify at this time, let us know and we shall accept your resignation.

The process for readmission is the same as for a new applicant with the exception of dues payment. Former members are not entitled to the reduced dues basis in effect for newly elected members. Therefore, your application for readmission should be accompanied with a check for \$60.00 (\$10.00 - readmission fee; and \$50.00 - one year's dues in advance subject to readmission). Applications should be secured from the local chapter, forwarded to the chapter so that it may add its recommendation; and then is forwarded by the chapter to The Institute for final action and consideration.
