Edgar D. Giberson, A.I.A., 52, a member of the Detroit Chapter of The American Institute of Architects, died at his home, 5242 Grayton Road, Grosse Pointe, Mich., on September 13

Born in Lima, Ohio, July 25, 1901, Mr. Giberson attended Cass
Technical High School in Detroit, Detroit Institute of Technology and Detroit Atelier, Beaux Arts Institute of Design. He also furthered his architectural studies by travel in this country.

Beginning as a blue print boy in the office of Smith, Hinchman & Grylls, Inc., Architects and Engineers, in Detroit, in 1917, he advanced through the various steps until he became chief designer in 1940, which position he held at the time of his death.

He became registered as an architect in Michigan, by examination, in 1938, and he was elected to membership in The American Institute of Architects, its Detroit Chapter and the Michigan Society of Architects in 1941. He was also a member of The Engineering Society of Detroit. He is survived by his wife, Etta, and a son, Alden.
