Lewis W. Giles Sr., Veteran Architect

Lewis W. Giles Sr., an architect in Washington for more than 50 years, died Sunday at George Washington University Hospital.

Born in Amelia County, Va., he came to Washington as a child more than 70 years ago. He studied architecture at the University of Illinois and then served in France in World War I.

Mr. Giles returned to Washington after the war and established his own office, designing many churches, apartment houses, office buildings and private homes in this area. He was the author of "The Master Specification," a technical publication for builders.

A charter member of Calvary Episcopal Church, Mr. Giles had served on its vestry for a number of years.

He is survived by his wife, Gladys W., of the home, 4428 Hunt PLANE; a son, Lewis W. Jr., of Columbia, Md.; a sister, Marian B. Campbell, of Los Angeles, and three grandchildren.

Lewis W. Giles, a District architect for more than 50 years, died Sunday in George Washington University Hospital after a brief illness. He lived on Hunt Place NE.

A native of Amelia County, Va., Mr. Giles came to the District at an early age more than 70 years ago. After graduating from Armstrong High School he studied architecture at the University of Illinois.

Mr. Giles designed many churches, apartment and office buildings and private homes in the Washington area. He also wrote "The Master Specification," which contains technical material for builders.

He leaves his wife, Gladys W.; a son, Lewis W. Jr., of Columbia, Md., an associate of his father for many years, and a sister and three grandchildren. Another son was the late Dr. Julian Giles, who once served as a director of the Tuskegee (Ala.) Veterans Administration Hospital.

Services will be held at 10 a.m. tomorrow in Calvary Episcopal Church, 820 6th St. NE, with burial in Lincoln Memorial Cemetery.
