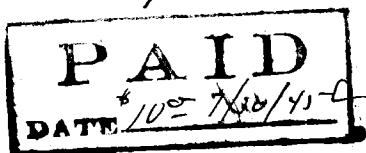

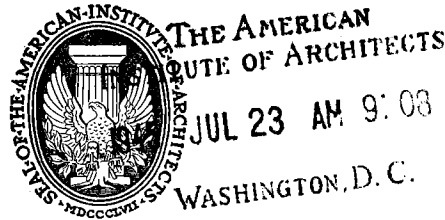

It is understood that during the summer months action of your board or committee may be deferred until September.

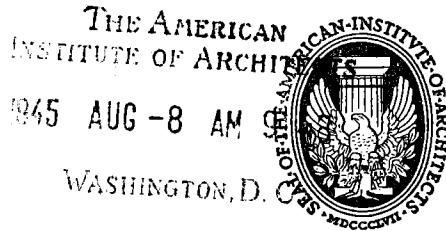
The next regular meeting of this Chapter will be the fourth Monday in September as meetings during July and August are suspended.

NOTICE OF SUSPENSION OF MEMBERSHIP

It is with much regret that we send to you, and to your chapter secretary, this notice of the suspension of your corporate membership in The Institute, and in its component organizations to which you are assigned—because of nonpayment of Institute dues described as follows: Regular Dues , Supplemental Dues .

This suspension is effective as of December 31, 1962. The sending of this notice has been delayed with the earnest wish that you might take some action in the matter.

The purpose of The Institute in permitting a membership to be suspended at the end of the year for default of dues rather than terminated forthwith is to enable the member in default to *restore his membership within the period of suspension, without applying therefore and without paying a readmission fee.* The period of grace terminates on December 31 of the year next following the date of suspension: in your case, on December 31 of the current year.
