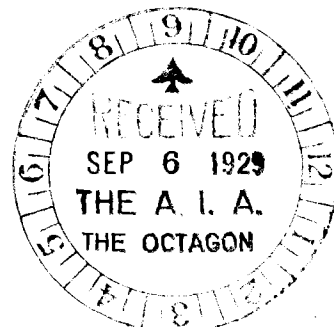


Dear Mr. Fugard:

Dear Mr. Hilgers:

On behalf of Mr. John R. Fugard, Treasurer of The Institute, we acknowledge your letter of January 3.

According to Institute records, your membership was terminated as of December 31, 1940, at which time you were in default for dues for the years 1939 and 1940, a total of \$40.00.

The Treasurer's office has no authority to act beyond that contained in the By-laws of The Institute, which provide that a member in default for dues for two years automatically terminates his membership.

Reinstatement procedure is simple. You need merely address a letter to The Secretary, requesting reinstatement, sending with the letter your dues in default, plus one year's dues in advance, plus the readmission fee of \$5.00.

We sincerely hope that business improves during 1941 and that you will find it possible to apply for reinstatement.
