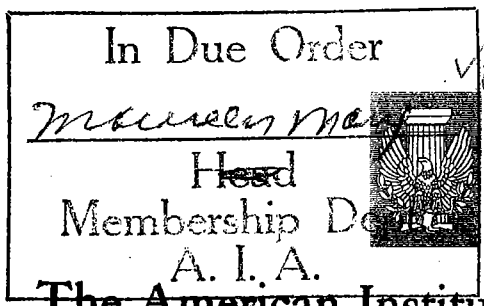

My husband was a very dynamic man who awoke at dawn (5*30 A.M.) and thrilled to rising of the sun as it travelled down Aimee and Rosamund Lamb's drive over to our home on the other side of the Blue Hills Parkway, He lived in a hurry and died the same way. He walked at least a mile every morning to the xff foot of the Blue Hills with our German Shepherd dog, Dutch.

He loved music - classical - and attended symphony. He loved painting and took lessons with a local water colorist - Jim Hooley. He loved good food and wine and was an excellent cook. He especially loved his cigars and always had one in his mouth. They contributed to his death - cancer of the lung.

He and I travelled with the children in a limited way - to Florida; To the New York World Fair; to the Canada Fair; Skiing in Vermont and New Hampshire. He loved to swim. We own a home in West Harwich where we had planned to retire. We belonged to the Nychmere Harbor Club in Harwichport. He built us a swimming pool last year on our Milton property. He preferred individual competitive sports to group sports. We travelled in Europe in 1967.

His funeral was a tribute to his many friendships. Frank Sargent, Governor of the Commonwealth of Massachusetts, was his classmate at M.I.T. His pallbearers included the Ancients and Honorables, the directors of his bank; Architects; Rotarians, Elks, members of Cigar Smokers of America. He was buried from the Catholic Church of which he was a member and the Church was filled to capacity with people standing on the steps.

Few honors and awards came to my husband. However, he took great pride in his family and he loved living every day with its challenge and rewards. We shall miss him dearly.
