In response to questions raised in your letters of June 18, concerning the applications for corporate memberships of Rhodes Elmore Rule, Rodney Robert Garner and Arthur Vernon Hoper, the Membership Committee of the Chapter wishes to 4dd the following information supplied in direct conversation with each man.

Arthur Vernon Hoyer is a Junior Associate of the Southern California Chapter. Prior to coming to California, Mr. Hower was employed by Mr. John K. Monroe, A.I.A. of Denver, Colorado for five years; and for Mr. Vernon Hoyt, A.I.A. of Denver for five years. At the present time he performs and directs the architectural phase of the work which is produced in the office of Mr. M. A. Nishkian, a licensed consulting engineer and a mechanical, chemical and civil engineer as well.

Rodney Robert Garner, whose entire professional activity is in the field of architecture, is the senior architect for the Southern California Edison Company. Six draftsmen are under his supervision producing architectural designs, layout and prelimmanary drawing for the company's commercial properties. Most of this work is later farmed out to private architectural firms for completion.

Rhodes Elmore Rule is a principal in the engineering firm of Bowen, Rule and Bowen, and is a licensed engineer, performing both architectural and engineering work for some time prior to acquiring his architectural licenses last year. He has both the engineering and architectural major design responsibility of the firm.

Mr. Rule graduated from the Eniversity of Southern California, Los Angeles, with an A.B., majoring in Geology and Math. He has no formal training in architecture and has not been employed by an architect. He did receive his architectural training in the firm of Bowen, Rule and Bowen, and mentioned several outstanding works completed as evidence.

I trust that this information herein contained will answer the questions raised concerning the above persons.
