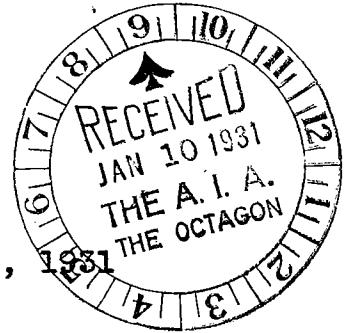

Dear Mr. Harrison:

In reply to your letter of November 23:

Our records show that Mr. George E. Gable resigned from The Institute on December 31, 1930, and owes no Institute dues.

A formal application need not be filled out by a former member when requesting re-admission. A letter to The Secretary of The Institute making such request, stating that he is a practicing architect, and check for \$25.00 (\$5.00 admission fee and \$20.00 for one year's dues in advance) will fulfill requirements. Further procedure is then taken care of by this office.

It is not customary to waive the re-admission fee of former members. However, if the circumstances were unusual and were set out, in a letter to that effect, accompanied with the recommendation of the chapter, The Board might be willing to waive the fee. As The Board will be in session this week, in Memphis, there probably will not be another meeting until May, just preceding the convention, whereat such action could be taken.

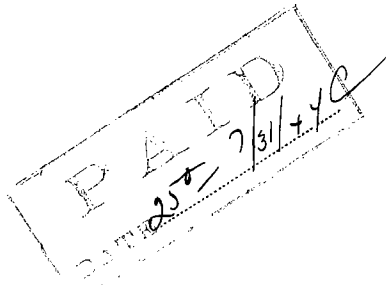
