

Dear Mr. Goble:

As you are aware, every corporate member of The Institute must be assigned to a local chapter and state organization where such exists and pay dues and assessments levied by that chapter and state organization.

Mr. Goble is in arrears with his dues to the New York Chapter in the amount of \$57.00 for our fiscal year 1967-68. I also note from the listing that I received from Mr. Panciera that he is also indebted to the Institute in the amount of \$50.00.

You might not know that Mr. Goble is quite ill. He is no longer with the Architectural Record. I have heard from other sources that he is under the impression that he is a Member Emeritus at the New York Chapter. I wrote to him on October 2Ist and informed him that he is not a Member Emeritus at present and is not eligible since he does not have the required number of years and age required by the Institute's By-Laws for the Membership Emeritus status. Citation For Emerson Goble

Emerson Goble, editor of Architectural Record, published by McGraw-Hill, Inc. has received a citation—the first it has ever given—from the Division of Hospital and Medical Facilities of the U.S. Public Health Service for his leadership in "improving hospital and health facilities design throughout the country."

Mr. Goble was cited for his contribution through "development of Euilding Types Studies and other articles on hospitals published in Architectural Record which have been a major contributing factor in the continuing improvement in hospitals design."

THE PRESENTATION was made on Aug. 11 in New York by Dr. Harold M. Graning, Assistant Surgeon General and Director of the USPHS Division of Mospital and Medical Facilities.

The many individuals in the Public Health Service who have been involved in improving hospital and health facility design throughout the country wish to acknowledge the important contribution you have made in your role as editor of Architectural Record." the citation read. "We are indeed grateful for

Your leadership in interpreting and reporting the objectives of the Hill Burton program, not only to the architectural profession but also to the hospital field, thus contributing immessurably toward elevating the quality of design from both a functional and an esthetic standpoint

"Your keen betwend interest in the promotion and development of building types studies and other articles on hospitals published in Architectural Record which have been a major contributing factor to the continuing approvement in hospital design.

"Your choice in giving us the benefits of your knowledge of the architectum siteld and your judgment of quality design which have been of invaluable assistance to those of us who have bad the responsibility for developing these architectural guidelines, particularly during

the early critical years of the program," it continued.

"It must be a source of great personal satisfaction to have made such meaningful contributions over such a long time span. In extending this citation we wish to you and yours an extra measure of happiness because of your dedication in the public interest," the citation's text concluded.

EMERSON GOBLE, 68, ARCHITECTS' EDITOR

CAMBRIDGE, Mass., Nov. 19—Emerson Goble, who retired in 1967 after nine years as editor and 17 years as managing editor of Architectural Record, died of cancer last night in Holy Ghost Hospital. He was 68 years old and lived in Rockport.

Mr. Goble was born in Elgin, Ill., and graduated from the University of Illinois in 1923. He became managing editor of Architectural Record, a McGraw-Hill publication, in 1941, and editor in 1958.

Mr. Noble was a member emeritus of the American Institute of Architects. The United States Public Health Service Division of Hospital and Medical Facilities cited him as "a major contributing factor to the continuing improvement in hospital design."

Chituary Emerson Goble, 68, Former Chief Editor

Emerson Goble, who retired in 1967 after nine years as Editor and 17 years as Managing Editor of Architectural Record, died November 18th in Holy Ghost Hospital, Cambridge, Mass., after a ten-year struggle with cancer. He was 68.

A memorial service was held on Saturday, November 22 in the First Congregational Church, Rockport, Mass., where Mr. and Mrs. Goble have been living since his retirement. A memorial service will also be held on Tuesday, November 25, at 3 P.M., in the First Congregational Church Chappaqua, 210 Orchard Ridge Road, Chappaqua, where Mr. and Mrs. Goble made their home from 1942 to 1967. Interment will be private. In lieu of flowers, contributions may be made to Project HOPE, Washington, D.C.
