





Sanford W. Goin, F.A.I.A., of Gainesville, Florida has been elected regional director of The American Institute of Architects from the South Atlantic district. The election took place this week during the Centennial Celebration of the national architectural professional society in Washington.

Principal architectural work of the new AIA director has been in the field of school design with Gainesville High School (1955) and Fernandia Beach High School (1956) as representative examples. Other work has included the First Methodist Church, First Christian Church, and the Religious Education Building at the First Baptist Church, all in Gainesville; Baptist Student Building at University of Florida. Goin's firm also has designed demonstration schools for the two large state universities.

Born in Frankfort, Kentucky in 1908, Goin received architectural training at the University of Florida. He was elected to AIA membership in 1942 and is assigned to the Florida North Chapter. In 1954 he was elevated to the rank of Fellowship in the Institute. He was president of the Florida Association of Architects 1950-52, having served previously as secretary-treasurer and as vice-president. At the present time he is chairman of the Florida Association's Education and Registration Committee.

Goin serves on the Alachua County Zoning Commission; the steering committee of the Florida Business Conference; and is a director of the Gainesville Mutual Building and Loan Association. He is a Mason and Kiwanian. From 1949 to 1951 he was a member of the Gainesville City Commission; 1947-48 City Plan Board, Gainesville; 1952-53 Mayor's Citizens Committee on Capital Improvement; 1952 Community Chest Investigating Committee. He served in a U.S. Naval Construction Battalion during World War II.

# Last rites today for Sanford Goin

Funeral services for Sanford W. Goin, Gainesville architect who died Friday from injuries received in a fall, will be held at 3 p.m. today at Williams - Thomas Funeral Home Chapel.

The 50-year-old architect was working on his houseboat in a neighbor's yard at 316 NE 13th Ave. Friday afternoon when he apparently caught his heel step-

ping backward on the boat. He tripped and fell 8-10 feet to the ground, landing on his head. Doctors said death was due to a fractured neck. He lived about five minutes after the fall.

The Goins live at 518 NE 4th Ave.

Goin was a Fellow with the American Institute of Architects and past president of the Florida Assn. of Architects, A.I.A. He was a director of the South Atlantic District and on the National A.I.A. Board.

### Former Commissioner

He was a former city commissioner, member of Alachua County Zoning Commission and the City Plan Board. At the time of his death he was a director of Gainesville Mutual Building and Loan, Alachua County School Board architect, a Kiwanian, American Legion member and a director of the Florida Foundation for the Advancement of Building, Inc. From 1948 - 57 he had been on the steering committee of the Florida Business Conference.

He and Jack Moore formed the architectural firm of Goin and Moore in 1948.

### Designed GHS

Architect Goin's firm designed Gainesville High School, First Christian Church, First Methodist Church, First Baptist Religious Education Building and the University of Florida Baptist Student Center, among others.
