I have your letter of the 29th of January enclosing promissory note for \$1,500 to be paid on or before 12-31-36.

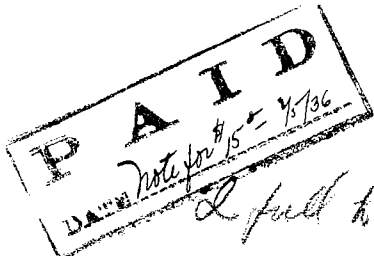
Your letter stipulates that I mail this signed note to you not later than 1-31-36 in order to avoid being suspended from the membership rolls.
