 - Very functional buildings, well detailed, fairly administered contracts, with total supervision (Result 100% repeat on clients)
 - Kemper knows that there is a solution to all problems and that buildings must facilitate their uses. Perhaps the most interesting project and possibly the most complicated in way of scheduling, design, afunction and circulation was the A-I Brewery Company in which Kemper was asked to remodel, convert and make additions to without disrupting the brewing process. This meant performing construction of sterile conditions. It meant temperature control and more than anything else it meant a complete knowledge of the process of brewing beer. Kemper read 2 or 3 books on the subject and became so knowledgeable in the clients field that the client used to kid him about becoming the head brewmaster. (see following page)

- While a Councilman, Kemper set the City on a course of acquiring park land early so that it could be developed as the neighborhoods grew in the area. He was instrumental in causing the City to plan for its future. While on the Planning and Zoning Commission he helped to establish the first zoning ordinance and has generally directed the growth of Tempe and the surrounding areas.
- Kemper is from a native Tempe family. He is well respected and was recently run for the public office of State Semator against a very powerful incumbent (the majority leader). The editorial which is enclosed appeared during that election and conveys, I believe, some of the semtiments shared throughout the community (by the way Kemper going against a landslide election narrowly missed defeating his opponent.)


